Proclaim his marvelous deeds to all the nations

Reflection

Today we "Sing to the Lord a new song!" In the first reading from Isaiah, the prophet announces that Israel will receive a new name. Instead of "desolate" or "forsaken," Israel shall now be called "espoused." Isaiah tells the nation, recently brought out of exile in Babylon, to begin again in their homeland to live out the covenant with their God. At the wedding feast in Cana we encounter Jesus who is also on the edge of something new. At the behest of his mother, he performs his first public sign and begins to reveal his identity to those closest to him. Our God is one of new beginnings. We are called to be a people of new behaviors, new actions, new love, new life.

Prayer

By star and water your glory has shone, and now at this feast of bridegroom and bride, your love is revealed by miraculous sign. May we ever proclaim God's marvelous deeds and sing of God's glory over all the earth, Amen.



Someone is Watching and Wondering



to comprehend how we need to live life as followers of Christ

The Christmas season is past and once again, liturgically, we are in Ordinary Time. Yet the focus of today's reading from I Corinthians sends my mind back to Christmas as we read of gifts, Spiritual Gifts to be specific. Chapter 12 begins: "Now concerning spiritual gifts, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. You know that when you were pagans, you were enticed and led astray to idols and could not speak. Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says 'Let Jesus be cursed!' and no one can say 'Jesus is Lord' except by the Holy Spirit." The chapter continues: "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit: there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit. To one is given through the Spirit the expression of wisdom; to another, the expression of knowledge according to the same Spirit; to another, faith by the same Spirit; to another, gifts of healing by the one Spirit; to another, mighty deeds; to another, prophecy; to another, discernment of spirits; to another, varieties of tongues; to another, interpretation of tongues. But

one and the same Spirit produces all of these, distributing them individually to each person as He wishes." Our Church interprets the Gifts of the Holy Spirit as shown above: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear/awe of the Lord. While it is always nice to receive material gifts from family and friends, God's gifts are unique. They are life-long, never malfunctioning, and inconsumable. God's gifts lead us to the hope, peace, joy and love which were the cornerstone of our Advent celebrations, realized through the Incarnation, and secured through the Passion of Christ Jesus.

As I write these words I realize how long it has taken me to realize the truth of this scripture passage and subsequent teachings of our Church. God provides for each of us. The individual gifts He gives are to lead us into right relationships. First right relationships with our Lord, right relationship with ourselves and our unique humanity, and right relationship with one another. We aren't meant to live His light into the world. To accomplish this baptismal mission requires patience, *agape*, and *metanoia* (trusting enough to turn our lives over to *Abba*, our Heavenly Father.) To restate, His gifts endure forever, they are incorruptible, but we must open our hearts and lives to receive them.

The St. James Food Kitchen has been completely remodeled (see pictures at the left).


These changes now requires 18 - 20 volunteers, instead of the previous 6 - 8.


