Someone is Watching and Wondering



Life can be tiring, even exhausting; often tragically so. For instance, work can be exhausting, looking for work even finding work requires so much effort. But what is most burdensome in life, what drags us down into the depths of despair, is the absence of love. Never receiving a smile or a warm welcome is discouraging.

Silences weigh on us, like those in families, between husbands and wives, between parents and children, among siblings, and for those who are abandoned and forgotten. Without love, this weighty exhaustion becomes intolerable. I think of the elderly and caregivers who live day to day without help. I think of those who are hungry and without shelter. I think of those working without pay and those on leave who will never receive back pay. I think of those battling illness, those facing death, and those who have lost loved ones. I think of people on our southern border, frightened and waiting for their request to be heard. I think of children who have no chance for education or a safe place to live. I think of every person whose future is unknown. Then I remember Jesus words: "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." (Matt 11:28)

If we want to see His light we must go forth, outside ourselves, and look for it. We cannot be withdrawn and simply watch what is happening around us. We must put our lives at stake and go forth. A Christian life is a continuous journey made of hope; it is a quest, like that of the Magi, even when the star momentarily disappears from our view. There will probably be dangers on this journey: superficial and mundane gossip, selfish whims, and the pit of pessimism that slow us down, paralyze and stymie hope. We can go forward, however, because Jesus says "Come to me, (I will show you the way) and I will give you rest."

Do you remember when you went out for recess and teams would be picked for kickball? I don't think this is allowed anymore, but they would go back and forth until it was down to the last two kids.

Most of the time, being chosen can make us feel good about ourselves. Someone else cares about us, needs us or even wants us. You are important, you matter.

"It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name he may give you" John 15:16

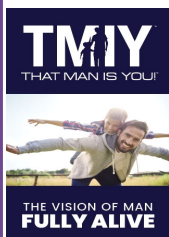

PB&J Stories

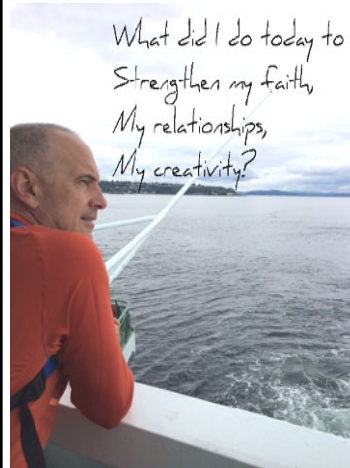

First Communion Notes

The Signup Genius will go out this week so that you can sign up for your child's First Communion Mass date, time, and pew. Just a few things to keep in mind:

* You may only sign up for one (1) date/pew – you can't "hold" multiple pews. This usually isn't a problem, but it did happen last year so I'd like to prevent that for this year. All that accomplishes is that I have to contact you and delete the second pew, which makes me feel like the Grinch. On top of that, there are plenty of pews available, so it's really not necessary.

* Pay attention to whether or not you are choosing the left or right sides - "left" is the front center section to your left as you stand in the back of the church facing the altar, ditto with "right."

* If you sign up for a pew and you change your mind, you can go back in to the Signup Genius, pick a new pew, and delete the pew you didn't want. If you have trouble with that, send me an email and I'm happy to take care of that for you.

* As a side note, while you can access the Signup Genius from your phone, I believe that some of the functions work better if they are done on a computer.

* We will post a name card on each pew on the Big Day, so you don't need to worry about remembering which pew you picked.

* If you have a LOT of family coming for this and you don't get a large pew (or prefer the more frontward pews), you can have the family come to Mass early and sit in any unreserved front pews. If you choose a pew in the left side section, there is another left side section where your family could sit directly across the aisle from you.

*Above all – and regardless of the 6 helpful hints just above--please don't stress over this! It always works out fine in the end. Just be prepared with a first and second choice, and you'll be set!
