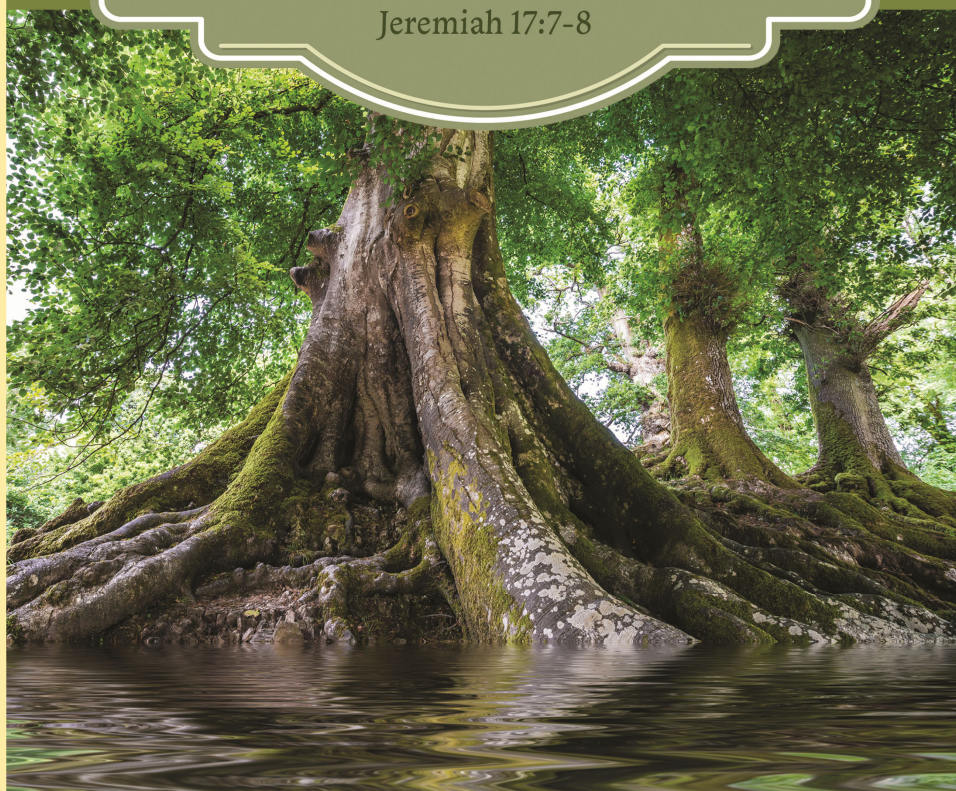

Someone is Watching and Wondering



In his book *God Came Near* Max Lucado writes a Chapter entitled "Women of Winter," where he presents the stories of three women found in the Gospel of Luke and John. In the first story (Luke 7:11-17) Jesus witnesses the burial procession of a widow's only son. Jesus, moved by compassion for the woman says: "Do not weep," then touching the brier commands "Young man I say to you rise." He then presents the widow her living son. The second story is of the Samaritan woman Jesus meets at the well (John 4:1-42). We all know this story where Jesus offers "life giving water" to the women shunned by her community for her sins. Finally the third story tells of the woman who had suffered from hemorrhages for more than 12 years. When she touches Jesus' clothes her hemorrhage stops and He tells her "Daughter your faith has made you well. Go in Peace." Each of these women were outcasts in their society, abandoned and left to suffer in silence, alone in the "winter of their lives." Yet Jesus didn't ignore them, send them away, ridicule, or condemn them. Instead through His love, He ministered to them.

Max Lucado challenges readers in this chapter to name the people of winter in our culture; people who are unwanted, unapproachable, nameless. People who we refuse to face and look into their eyes. Perhaps our winter people are the geeky nerds at school, the homeless, the veteran with PTSD, the ugly, undocumented immigrants, alcoholics, divorcees, the handicapped, children on the Autism spectrum, elderly alone in nursing homes, children separated from their parents, battered women. While the cold, ice and snow may be curtailing some of my activities at this time, I remain sheltered, warm, and fed. I am not alone, yet as His disciple I must ask, how do I show God's mercy to people on my list; the nameless winter people?

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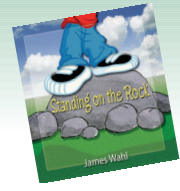

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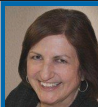
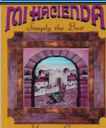
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
