Let's just get a Mickey Mouse sweatshirt and stay here in Orlando and skip the flight back home. Well if you are reading this and you see me, you know I lost the bet and had to return home.

Last weekend, I was in Orlando, FL, for the Precious Blood Companions retreat. It was a wonderful weekend. Sunshine, green grass, and a chance to just sit and watch the herrings graze and carelessly walk by. Fr. Dave Kelly, along with Sr. Donna and two of the men from Precious Blood Ministry of Reconciliation in Chicago led our weekend. It was the fifth and final presentation of this year's series of retreats. Fr. Dave and the gang shared stories of the ministry in Chicago and invited each of us to reflect upon how we live Precious Blood spirituality in our own lives and our home places. Johnathon and Lamont, two young men from PBMR, shared their stories. They first began to come to the Center many years ago and now today have joined the staff as leaders and case worker. They speak from their own experiences and how PBMR has changed their lives and outlook of their futures. Our dream of making a difference in that community and people's lives is coming to fulfillment. It's not too say everything is now perfect and there is no longer a threat of violence, but it is to say people are finding hope once again and are making a difference.

As I write this, I'm sitting in the airport waiting to board the plane to head back to the cold. My long sleeve shirt and sweatshirt are packed in my suitcase. I'm wearing my summer sandals while my boots are packed away. The sun is bright and sunny and warm and I'm not real excited to head back to the cold. 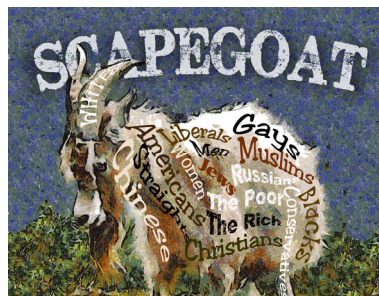

Someone is Watching and Wondering



The Jewish Feast of the Atonement has its roots in the 16th chapter of Leviticus where the ritual of preparing a sacrifice to God and "scapegoating" are described. Aaron was instructed to symbolically

lay all the sins of the people on a goat and the people would beat the animal until it fled into the desert. This was a vivid act to unite and free the people. Instead of admitting their faults, this ritual allowed them to place their sinfulness elsewhere.

This image of scapegoating powerfully mirrors the universal, largely unconscious, human need to transfer guilt. In fact, scapegoating is foundational for the formation of social groups and cultures. An example in our culture today is blaming all immigrants for rising crime and drug abuse in this country. This type of blaming leads to the false conclusion that closing our borders will lead to an instant reduction in violence and addiction. Certainly a false conclusion, leading to no solution, and harming many individuals who are merely seeking a better life for themselves and their families. Yet we humans are mired in casting blame on almost anything or anyone other than ourselves. It is difficult to confront our weaknesses, negativity, and societal problems. We despise and do not want to face our own imperfections, which we see mirrored in other people. We use religion and religious beliefs to justify violence, ignore the needs of others, separate people into the good and the evil, and hide from our own darkness and sin. Remember Jesus' words on the cross: "Father forgive them for they do not know what they are doing." (Luke 23:34) Jesus stood guiltless but with sinners, condemned by the highest authorities of both church and state.

As we approach the Lenten season isn't it time to face our own sin and darkness and accept the consequences of our actions? Isn't it time to stop scapegoating, casting blame on others and seek God's help to lead us into solidarity, compromise, solutions, hope and peace? Isn't it time to recognize pride, greed, gluttony, lying and narcissism? Jesus said: "And when he comes (the Spirit), he will prove the world wrong about sin and righteousness and judgment". (John 16:8). Isn't it time to face our sinfulness and change?

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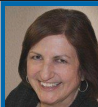
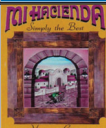
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
