Ash Wednesday 2019 – Baptism of the Lord 2020

Bishop Johnston has proclaimed a Holy Year of Renewal for our diocese.

The Holy Year of Renewal is tied directly to the Mutually Shared Vision as a spiritual preparation for the whole diocese, opening ourselves up to the Holy Spirit to help us. As good as the plans in the Vision are, with clearly stated Priorities and Goals, it's ultimately not about what we are doing, it's about what God is doing through us. The Holy Year is a spiritual time to reflect upon the Vision in a personal and communal way in our homes and parishes.

This special, graced time will give us many opportunities to reflect together on the Priorities and how they can benefit us as a diocese. Each month our celebration will focus on various themes from the Mutually Shared Vision. There will be events throughout the year to bring us together as One Family. Additionally, there will be suggestions for concrete actions of ways to mark the year with prayer and service.

The theme for March is "One Family: Restored in Christ – Equipped for Mission"

Throughout Lent the theme is "The Light Is On For You" and additional opportunities for confession will be offered at parishes throughout the Diocese.

At St. James additional confession times will be offered on from 6-7pm on Monday, March 11, 18 and 25. And from 7:30 - 8:30am on Saturday, April 5 and 12.

### Someone is Watching and Wondering



I recently read a book that I would like to share with you as we begin the Season of Lent this week through the Ash Wednesday liturgies. The title of the book is *The Leavers* by Lisa Kim. It is the story of two people searching for answers and meaning in their lives and relationships. The first is a mother who entered the United States illegally from China, when she was 19 years of age. She was seriously in debt (from paying a loan-shark for the journey to this country) and pregnant. Shortly after arriving in New York City her son was born. The mother struggles to provide a life for him even though she questions her suitability for motherhood; she loves the boy very much and desires a better life for him. When her son is 11 years old, she disappears and he is eventually adopted by a white, American couple who are professors, at a small college in up-state New York. Given this introduction and the passage of 11 years, the majority of the novel consists of monologues in the mother and son's minds. He is trying to understand why his mother left and where he belongs. He is conflicted and unable to move beyond the emptiness he feels. She not only questions herself and her actions but is attempting to explain to her son the situation surrounding her leaving and what her life has been during the intervening years.

*The Leavers* is a complicated, emotional story. The setting is contemporary and the message on immigration reflects what is happening now in our history as a nation. I was moved by this novel and was left questioning what, if anything, I can do to make a difference in the lives of immigrants in our midst. Coming to mind as I prepare for reflection and self-examination during this Lenten season is to strive to love as Jesus loved; to refrain from making judgments based on race, religion, economic status, orientation, or immigration status; to pray for God's guidance in helping me receive each of His children as a brother or sister and recognize that they are also beloved by God. I don't believe that I am isolated or set apart because I am a Catholic. Instead, being Catholic forces me into relationships with all humanity, embracing our rich diversity.

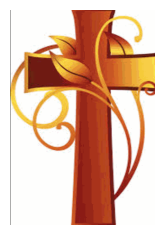

### Why Attend The Stations of the Cross?



Could you walk a mile in Jesus' shoes? The Stations of the Cross (also known as the Way of the Cross) bring us closer to Christ as we meditate on the great love He showed for us in His most sorrowful Passion!

The Stations of the Cross provide us with great material for prayer and meditation. Tracing Jesus' journey from condemnation to crucifixion increases both our sorrow for our sins and our desire for His help in avoiding temptations and in bearing our own crosses. Meditating on Christ's passion can help us become more like Him in imitating His virtues of obedience, humility, charity, patience and perseverance.

Pilgrims to the Holy Land commemorated Christ's Passion in a similar manner as early as the 4th century A.D. The Stations of the Cross developed as a devotion in earnest, however, around the 13th to 14th centuries.

It became a way of allowing those who could not make the long, expensive, arduous journey to Jerusalem to make a pilgrimage in prayer, at least, in their church! Although the original number of stations varied greatly, they became fixed at 14 in the 18th century.

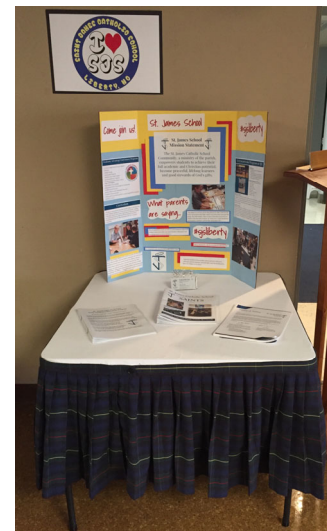

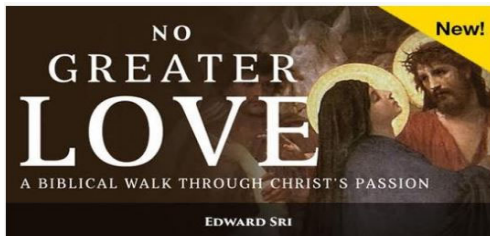
