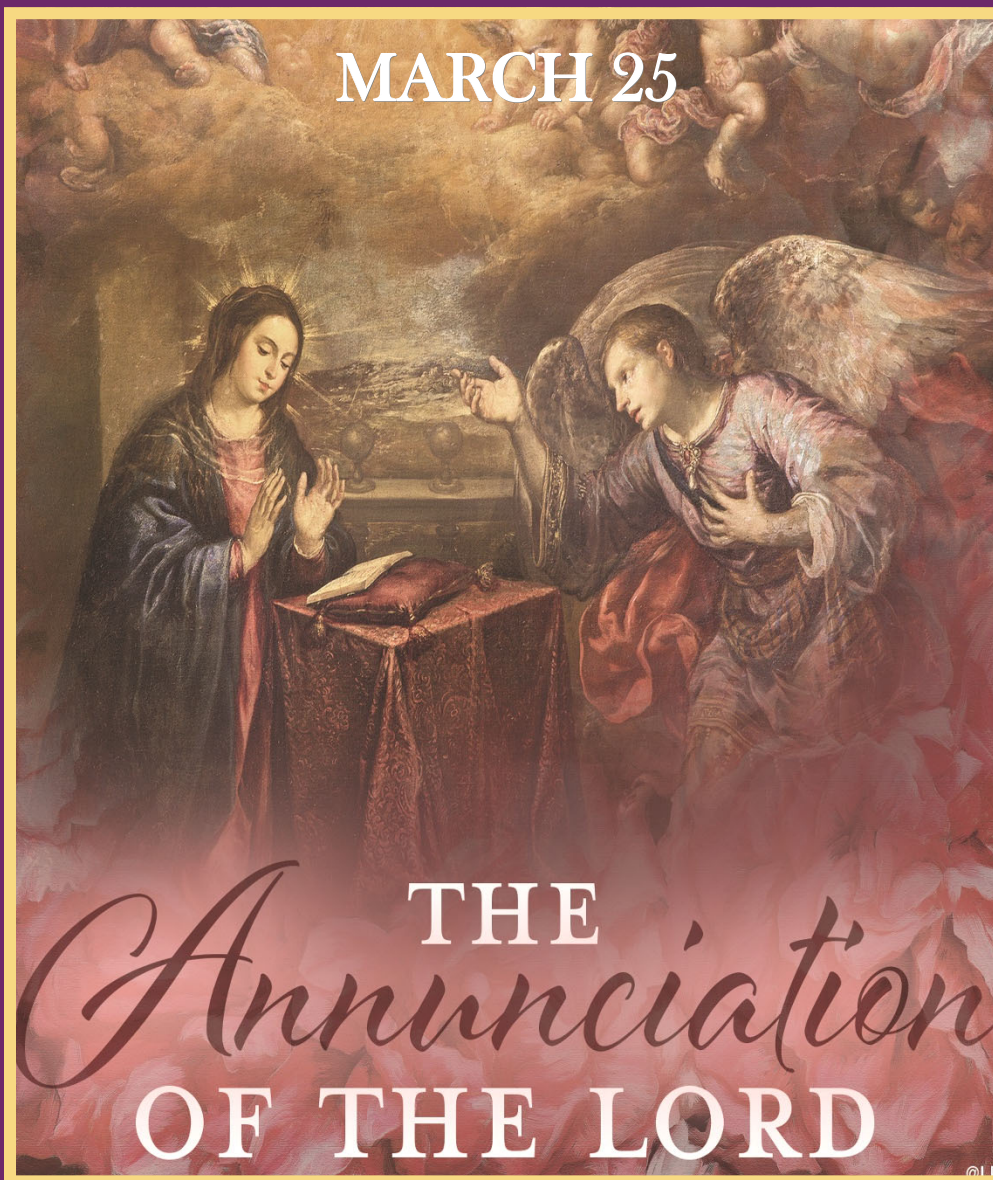

From the Pastor's Pen

This past Wednesday, March 20, we celebrated the Spring Equinox. The word *equinox* comes from the Latin words for "equal night"—*aequus* (equal) and *nox* (night). On the equinox, the length of day and night is nearly equal in all parts of the world. With the equinox, we enjoy increasing sunlight hours, with earlier dawns and later sunsets. Even more interesting is we had a full moon on the Spring Equinox.

Pulling information from The Old Farmers Almanac, and tradition dating back to Native Americans, we also have a Full Worm Moon that happened within one day of the Spring Equinox. The last time this happened was 19 years ago, in 2000, and the next time will be in 11 years. The March's full moon on March 20 was also a supermoon, meaning it is slightly larger than most of other full moons as it is the closest to the Earth. The Full Worm Moon takes its origins from Native Americans as the ground begins to soften for earthworms to reappear and roots and seeds begin to sprout and grow once again.

My father and I would sorta follow the Almanac in planting our spring garden. We would be planting potatoes by the Ides of March. According to the Almanac for this year, for planting above ground crops March 15 and 16, below ground March 5, 23, and 24. For setting eggs March 21, 22, and 29. And for fishing, March 6-20. Does all this really make any sense? Does any of this really make any difference? I'm not sure, but it's also something to ponder and there are those who follow it religiously. Who knows. I just know growing up by the time March rolled around we were ready to get outside and Mom was probably happy to see us go.

It was also around this time each spring we would receive in the mail 50 - 100 new chicks. They would ship USPS and the mailman was ever so happy to get them delivered. There was however, one year he got caught with them in a snowstorm and was delayed a couple days delivering them. Oh what a mess!

Oh the joys of springtime! I am so looking forward to getting outside, playing in the dirt and discovering how kind Mother Nature will be this year in helping to make the yard beautiful once again.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Over the next three Sundays our faith community will celebrate the Scrutinies with the Elect; those individuals preparing for Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. The Scrutinies are intense prayers of the Church that encourage a spirit of repentance so that Christ may fill **us** with His light and love and that the spirit of evil in **our** hearts and lives be replaced with His spirit of kindness and mercy. Notice I have used the pronouns "us" and "our." In other words although the Elect are called forward during this ritual and we the Church pray for them, the Scrutinies are inclusive. We are also praying for ourselves and one another.

For this 1st scrutiny we hear the familiar story of the Samaritan Woman who meets Jesus at the community well. Through this meeting Jesus not only speaks of her personal sinfulness but He also offers her life-giving water. Maybe you don't truly relate to this woman but perhaps these words of ritual prayer will help: that all may ponder the word of God in their hearts and savor its meaning more fully day by day; that all may learn to know Christ, who came to save what is lost; that we may humbly confess our sins and sincerely reject everything in our lives that is displeasing and contrary to Christ; that the Holy Spirit helps us to overcome our weakness; that we may put our hope in Christ finding peace and holiness in Him; that we seek a change of heart, give ourselves to prayer and persevere in good works; that we may be freed from the spirit of mistrust; that we long for the same living water Christ offered to the Samaritan Woman; and that by accepting Jesus as our teacher we may become true worshipers of God the Father in spirit and in truth. I think it's easy to recognize that these prayers are not meant only for the Elect but rather are words for each of us in our daily lives.

We know that you hear about the HOPE program every Sunday before Mass, but it's worth saying again how great a program this is and how much it helps our parish. Just by families diverting their normal, everyday purchases through the gift card program, our parish benefits. But since the dollar amounts on each transaction are small, we need volume to make the program work. Our school families are required to purchase \$1,500 per year, and that sounds like a huge amount, but when you break it down, it's only \$125 per month. What family doesn't spend \$125 on groceries, gas, Target runs, hitting the drive-thru, etc., etc., etc.?

If every family in our parish diverted \$125 per month of their spending through the gift cards, our parish would be awash in a sea of cash. Well, okay maybe that's an exaggeration, but that our finance person would be much happier! So if you aren't a regular HOPE purchaser, maybe think about shooting for that \$125 per month goal. It can't hurt, and it would really help!

Dying to Ourselves – Are You Fruit?

“... ‘For three years now I have come in search of fruit on this fig tree but have found none. [So] cut it down. Why should it exhaust the soil?’ He said to him in reply, ‘Sir, leave it for this year also, and I shall cultivate the ground around it and fertilize it; it may bear fruit in the future. If not you can cut it down.’ Luke 13: 7-9

“Stewardship calls for us to die to ourselves and live new lives in Jesus Christ.” This quote is from Mr. Tracy Welliver’s book on Everyday Stewardship. So I ask – Are we willing to die to ourselves, so we can bear fruit for God? Share in His abundance of Grace? Can we “end” our old life – our old ways – and begin a “new” one – in His grace? Am I exhausting the soil? Or can I cultivate and fertilize my life so as to bear Christ’s fruit for others?

Lent is a great time for the reflection of where is my life? Where do I sit with where God wants, calls me to be? As said before – this is not easy. Times in life when this is easy, probably are the times things are going good, life seems to be cruising along. But is that when we are dying to ourselves? Probably not.

Mr. Welliver also said something that hit very true to me, “the power of the cross can bring a person to tears.” The pain and anguish Jesus endured for me. Me and You – unfathomable! The cross is a powerful emotional symbol, because it is personal. He was hated and tortured, so I could have new life. I don’t think it gets more personal than that.

So again – Do I do everything I can for Him? No, I don’t. But as long as I keep trying to be a good steward and spread His Love, I think He will keep trying to cultivate me.

Lent is a great time to reflect and attempt to change habits. This week and possibly the rest of Lent, find some prayer; additional short time with God; small act of kindness that you can add to your everyday life. Maybe the cultivation will take hold and become part of your daily routine. I think He might like that!

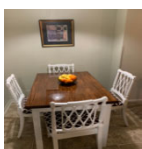

Our new resident has moved into our Hillcrest apartment. Please keep Rebecca in your family prayers as she adjusts to life in the Hillcrest program. It's like Life-skills Boot Camp, so it will be challenging for her, but the rewards in the end will be great.



This picture is of the dining nook in the apartment with the table and chairs that Jody Kittell reworked, refinished, and refurbished! I also want to thank all of you who donated grocery gift cards, made food for her Welcome Home meal, or donated lamps and household items – it was awesome! Your support makes our little apartment feel like someplace warm you could come home to.

Which brings me to our next small dilemma – we always find when we change residents, that there are things that need to be replaced. Currently, we have no funds to cover that, and as we often are moving residents in quickly, there is rarely time to pass the hat or ask for specific donations. What I'd like to set up is a small stash of Walmart gift cards so that we could replace things like stove burner pans or kitchen towels or sheets. We don't need to stockpile a huge dollar amount, because we do have access to the Thrift Store for anything that would be larger or more expensive, but they don't usually have much in the way of household linens or small kitchen items, and that's typically what we need to replace.

So if you'd be willing to donate a Walmart gift card, you can drop it by the parish office anytime, or by my office (there's a mail slot in the door). The HOPE table sells Walmart cards, which makes it convenient. We can hold on to the cards until we have a resident move out and we assess what we need to replace or refurbish and then we can send someone to the store to pick up what we need. Your support is always gratefully appreciated!
