Blessings to you and your family as celebrate Spring and continue our Lenten journey.

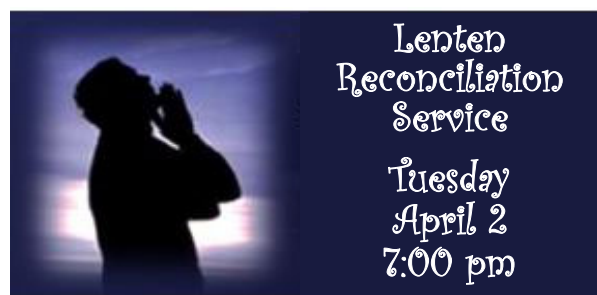

Reflection

We might imagine Psalm 34 as the song of one who has been redeemed and saved. In fact, it could be the psalm of the prodigal returned to dignity and joy as a child of God.

The Psalmist sings, "Look to him that you may be radiant with joy, and your faces may not blush with shame." Our God wants nothing more than to find the lost and to save the sinner.

The truth is, each and everyone of us is in need of repentance. And experiencing our need for forgiveness, we can share in the joy of the prodigal returned fully to His Fathers embrace.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Today we celebrate the 2nd Scrutiny beginning with the retelling of the story of a man, blind from birth, whom Jesus heals. The healing isn't the focus of today's Rite. Rather I ask you to think for a moment about the reaction of the disciples who asked Jesus: "Who sinned, this man or his parents?" or the Phari-

sees who stated that Jesus "is not from God because he does not keep the Sabbath;" or the towns people who said "You were born totally in sin, and are you trying to teach us?" Jesus' reply should strike each of us deeply: "I came into this world for judgment, so that those who do not see might see, and those who do see might become blind." Do we profess to see yet remain blind, or are we blind seeking sight?

For me this blind man represents all who have felt ostracized, only because they look different, have a disability, come from another country, are poor, under/uneducated, infirmed, practice their faith differently, are imprisoned, elderly, or without the means to support and care for themselves. Where are those among us who like this man are outcast and forced to beg for their existence? Who is shunned in our community, culture, and world? Who do we accuse, criticize, ridicule, and defame? What names do we hurl? What are the sins of our society that we fail to address? Who are the scapegoats? Rather than showing compassion and kindness to our fellow brothers and sisters, recognizing that all are God's children, we point our fingers and blame.

Rather than working to find solutions that respect one another, we pass the buck believing the problems are not our own or we are not the cause. Rather than working to preserve the dignity of every person, rather than fighting to protect and restore the environment, we close our eyes. I ask, Who is blind, Who has sinned? and I pray that I might become an instrument of God's mercy, healing, and forgiveness

Stewardship of Treasure

We can see the New Church Building is coming along. I wanted to give you some update on the expenses and where we stand today.

Current charges paid out against the contract are \$7,199,383

We have opened the loan just this week (3/19), so we are borrowing now (\$225,565). Going forward I will report on the receipt of funds designated for the New Church Fund and the loan amount. I think this will continue to give a good picture to everyone on where we stand.

As always, if anyone has questions or concerns, please reach out to me. If the new reporting does not seem to answer our questions and provide information that we, the parishioners, want to see, I will change the reporting until we get to the correct format.

So many folks have been faithful to their pledge and to all who continue to give and support our parish everyday – THANK YOU! We would not be where we are today without the faithfulness of those in the pews.
