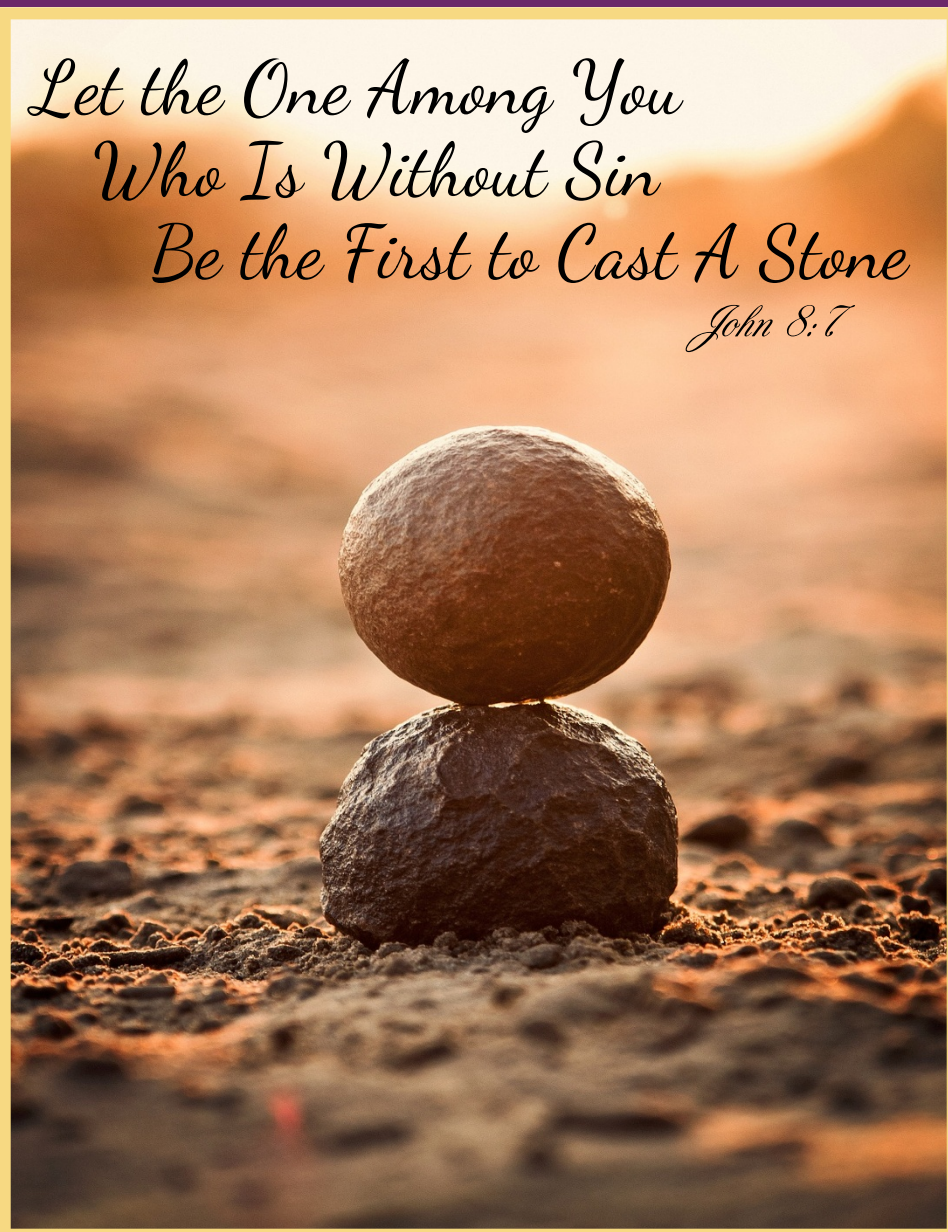

From the Pastor's Pen

So what great April's Food Day prank did you pull this year? What great prank got you? A smile still comes across my face as I recall the pranks we pulled on each other growing up. How easy it was to fool someone else and how easy it was to let ourselves get fooled. Some pranks were totally fun and others were downright cruel. I think one of the best ones was the year that the cooks put a note on the doors of the cafeteria and on the front it said, "No lunch today!" And when you flipped it up, it said, "Ha! April Fools!" Almost everyone of us who walked by the doors that day stopped to read it.

I sometimes like history and was wondering of the origins of this prankster day. No one seems to know its true origin, but many have speculated based upon pranks others have championed. The one explanation I like is that it is around the vernal equinox, or the first day of spring in the Northern hemisphere. It was Mother Nature playing tricks on people with the changing weather and not knowing what to expect. Sorta sounds like the same thing this year as we go from 30 degrees to 60 degrees one day to the next. And then the past weekend, the dusting of snow after how many days of warm weather.

Reflection

Well he certainly has! Even in the 40 day desert of Lent, there is hope and joy! Today's psalm reminds us of God's never ending love. He's doing something NEW in each and everyone of us. As I reflect on the psalm and all the readings this weekend I also reflect on the upcoming one year anniversary of my liver transplant. God really did have something new in store for me. The Lord "worked great deeds for me," just as he did for the exiles. God truly works "in mysterious ways" which our faith should correspond.

Imagine the scene depicted in this beautiful Psalm which "seemed like a dream", and the utter bewilderment of the conquered people of Babylon. As indentured people the Jews worked the fields of Babylon, sowing seed and harvesting the grain as depicted in this Psalm, going into the fields "full of tears" except returning for the last time "full of song, carrying their sheaves". Sometimes the storms of life weigh us down, but the love of God carries us through, singing songs of joy!

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Have you ever been in a situation where you felt completely helpless. Perhaps you have sat with someone in Hospice care, or watched a loved one battle the de-

mon of addiction, or held the hand of a parent who has lost their child through the violent act of another. If you relate to any of these scenarios, then perhaps today's 3rd Scrutiny will help guide you away from the sin of despair and hopelessness and toward the life giving peace of Christ.

In John's gospel we read Martha's words when Jesus arrived following the death of her brother Lazarus: "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." Have you ever asked God WHY or cried "if only you had been here?" Have you felt abandoned by God, that your prayers were unanswered? Did you stay in that dark place, alone and in the clutches of evil despair? I know that I have. In some very dark moments, I wondered if God was listening to my prayer and I have asked why did such and such happen more than once. Facing such feelings and thoughts can be difficult but I think the purpose of today's gospel is to embrace the second sentence from Martha: "[But] even now I know that what you ask of God, God will give you." Martha proclaims her true faith and complete trust in Jesus. She places herself not only into His care but she gives Him her life. She doesn't question, like I certainly would be tempted to do. Rather, she seems to embrace "let your will be done." How many times have I prayed "thy kingdom come, thy will be done" and simply can't let go of my wants and desires, or stated another way, what I really want is "my will be done."

A wise man once told me to stop asking why and ask how. Another wise man told me how impossible it may seem to understand God's answers and God's time. Yet today I ask God, "How do I let go? How can I surrender to your will? How do I replace my despair and hopelessness with peace and hope? I believe Martha's response provides an answer: even now I know that I can trust Jesus, place my life in His hands, and surrender to His will.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**Palm Sunday**

Next weekend, churches provide palms to be carried in the opening moments of the liturgy, as we gratefully recall Jesus' entry into the holy city of Jerusalem. The children who greeted him on that day used what was both handy and traditional, since palms were carried to inaugurate the joyful harvest feast of Succoth. To this day, faithful Jews are directed to take a beautiful palm branch, green and straight as possible, called a *lulav*, and bind it with three myrtle branches fifteen inches long, and two longer willow branches. At the end of the temple service, everyone carries the *lulav*, circling the sanctuary in a dance called the *Hoshanot*, singing hymns of joy.

In other climates, Jews and Christians alike have had to make accommodations over the years. In Italy, everyone carries olive branches today, often brought from their own garden. In England, forsythia branches are preferred, a relative of the olive, sign of peace. Germans prefer pussywillows, and others look for flowering spring branches. In our part of the world, we use palm branches to express joy and welcome, and to remind us of the joy of Christ's victory even as we prepare to commemorate his passion?

The Pennsylvania grand jury report, published in August of 2018, brought the scandal of clergy sex abuse in the US to the forefront once again. In the following months, headlines about abusive priests, indifferent bishops, predatory cardinals and Vatican corruption ensued. Pope Francis held a world-wide summit in Rome in February, the "Protection of Minors in the Church" (www.pbc2019.org). A number of issues have been identified with strong calls for reform including more leadership by laity in the handling of clergy sex abuse. Now, more than ever, we have an opportunity to change the way the world and our Church responds to sexual abuse and to help those who have been harmed. Since each of us make up the Church, how will you impact this movement?

#JOINTHECONVERSATION

DID YOU KNOW?

- 1:4 girls and 1:6 boys will be sexually abused by the age of 18
- Abusers of children are people we know and trust
- 73% of child sexual abuse victims do not tell anyone for at least a year
- 45% of victims do not tell anyone for at least 5 years
- Some victims wait decades to disclose while some never disclose their abuse
- The residual effects of having been abused can last a lifetime
- Predators entice children online through games, apps and sites they frequent

The Devotion of the Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Recitation of the Seven Sorrows Rosary
Friday, April 12 - After 9am Mass
and 4:30pm in the Church



Our Lady's Sorrows are commemorated on the liturgical calendar twice a year - the Friday before Palm Sunday and September 15. Commemorating the Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin Mary twice a year

demonstrates how important this devotion is to Heaven.

All are invited and encouraged to participate in the recitation of the Seven Sorrows Rosary on Friday, April 12.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY IS APRIL 28 2:00 - 3:30pm in the Church



Divine Mercy Sunday is the Sunday after Easter. Our Lord asked Saint Faustina to pray and work towards establishing a Feast of Divine Mercy on that day.

When Pope John Paul II canonized Sister Faustina (making her Saint Faustina), he also, on the same day, surprised the entire world by

establishing Divine Mercy Sunday as a feast day for the entire Church.

He set aside this day as a day of forgiveness of sin and punishment due to sin (with sacramental confession 20 days before or after and receiving Holy Communion).

He even prayed the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, the prayer that Jesus gave her, at the saint's tomb. Given all these connections between St. Faustina and Divine Mercy, is it any wonder that Pope John Paul II died on the Vigil of Divine Mercy Sunday (the evening before the feast day), which fell that year on April 3, 2005 and was canonized St. John Paul II on the Feast of Divine Mercy, 2014.

Our Divine Mercy celebration will be April 28, with Eucharistic Adoration from 2:00-3:30pm, including opportunities for Confession, private devotion, and praying and singing of the Divine Mercy Chaplet and Benediction. This year we will have the Blessed Oil of Saint Faustina available for you to bless yourself or other religious items, such as a rosary or medal.
