PRE-DEDICATION FUNDRAISER


What could be better than to have tons of fun and at the same time raise funds for our New Church? On July 27th you will be able to do just that.

FLOOR MEDALLIONS

When you walk into a new space, there are many lights the baptismal font. The following medalthings that catch your eyes! For instance, when you walk into our new church, your eyes may be instantly drawn to the 33 foot tall mural of the Transfiguration or perhaps the bronze crucifix. You certainly won't miss the new baptismal font as you enter the church, but more about that in another article. As you stand there gazing around don't forget to look down at your feet, for at the beginning of our you will be guided along your journey by six medallions. These medallions will be cut stone comprising of 5 different colors that lead us on our spiritual path.

Spiritually, the medallions are placed in sets of two. The first one is inspired from the floor plan of Santiago de Compostela Cathedral in Spain and is very geometric in style. The second medallion is an image that relates to the previous medallion. Of the 5 colors of stone used in each floor medallion, the green is reserved for the most sacred or important part of the medallion.

So let's begin our journey. As we walk past the baptismal font to the main aisle, we come to our first geometric style medallion inspired by the

Cathedral and see the words "WE ENTER THROUGH BAPTISM." The geometric pattern of this medallion is the entrance to the Cathedral in Spain, and the green stone used inside the medallion highlion along our journey that relates to the first and

has the Greek letters for Alpha and Omega on each side of the Chi Rho symbol. The Chi Rho symbol is one of the earliest forms christogram. All together; baptism (alpha) through our life to death (omega) we do all things with



Christ (Chi Rho) who is with us always. The Chi Rho symbol is green in this medallion.




Now we've reached the half-way point in our journev and we come to the third floor medallion. On this one, we see the words "ASSISTED BY THE PRAYERS OF THE SAINTS." The green stone rectangles used here represent

the altars with shrines dedicated to various saints where visitors to the Cathedral can kneel and pray. The next medallion that correlates with this is the image of two hands praying, holding the cross. For this medallion, the cross is made of the green stone.



Floor Medallions (con't)

As we reach our final destination, the altar on which we celebrate the Eucharist, the source of



summit of our lives, we see the two final floor medallions. On one, we see the words "ARRIVING AT OUR UNITY IN CHRIST." The green stone, once again being used to highlight the important feature symbol-

izes the altar at the Cathedral in Spain. The other, the final medallion in our journey, is the

host and chalice, the Body and Blood of Christ, given to us at this altar. The green stone will be used on the cross on the chalice and again in the host.



This is just a brief summary of what is sure to grow into a more, in depth, spiritual reflection of our own journey with Christ. Everyone walks his or her own path. May we walk always with Christ.
