



From the Pastor's Pen

As spring time approaches and we are greeted each morning with a beautiful sunrise and more and more blooming flowers, I am reminded of the phrase I heard my grandparents speak this time of the year as we were running for shelter to escape the rain, "April showers bring May flowers." Over and over, I would hear someone repeat that phrase. I never really thought to much of it at the time. Thinking of it again this spring, I became curious and wondered what sort of story might be behind the phrase.

It reaches back to the mid 1500s, although earlier use of "April showers bring May flowers" probably existed. In 1557, a man by the name of Thomas Tusser compiled a collection of writings he called "A Hundred Good Points of Husbandry." In the April husbandry section, he wrote: *Sweet April showers Do spring May flowers.*

In addition, there is meaning behind the words. In one sense, it is a reminder that even the most unpleasant of things can bring about very enjoyable things indeed. For example, the heavy rains of April, can bring about an abundance of flowers in May. It can also be a reminder of a lesson in patience, that good things are worth the wait.

Many of life's greatest things come only to those who wait. By patiently and happily enduring the clouds and dampness of April, we can more easily take in the sights and smells of the beautiful flowers of May. Sometimes beginning with a more optimistic attitude allows us to be more open to seeing something beautiful and wonderful later in life.

How many stories have we heard or experiences have we had because someone was willing and able to wait? Or maybe, we ourselves experienced something wonderful because we were able to endure a bit of cloudy skies? Perseverance and hard work can and does contribute to great accomplishments.

If the saying is true, then after the rains we have had this spring, we should have an over abundance of May flowers. Will it be so?

May is a time of celebrating great accomplishments as graduations approach, end of the school year. We celebrate the many Mom's in our lives with Mother's Day. We remember and celebrate May dedicated to Mary, Mother of God and our Mother. So many ways we wait in anticipation and hope of something wonderful to celebrate.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



In our Easter Bulletin there was an insert titled *Celebrating the Easter Season at Home*, I was particularly moved by the article, *The Fruit of the Spirit in Real Life* which listed nine dimensions or facets of the fruits of the Holy Spirit (love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control). I was reminded of the areas in my life that need help and subsequently I have spent some time reflecting on how I might become more wholly Christian, living so as to reflect Christ to the world. As part of my quiet, reflective time (which generally includes spiritual reading) I stumbled upon St. Barnabas and his evangelization to the non-Jewish community.

The Acts of the Apostles describes, “a Levite, a native of Cyprus, Joseph, to whom the apostles gave the name Barnabas (which means ‘son of encouragement’) [who] sold a field that belonged to him, then brought the money, and laid it at the apostles feet.” (4:36-37) It was also Barnabas who introduced Paul to the disciples (Chapter 9:27), who the disciples sent to investigate the gentiles in Antioch who were proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus, and who later traveled with Paul on the first missionary journey to Cyprus (Acts 13). Tradition states that Barnabas preached in Alexandria and Rome, was the founder of the Cypriot Church, and was stoned to death at Salamis around 61 AD. I was inspired by the generosity and faithfulness of St. Barnabas, which are at times lacking in my life and witness to the Gospel. Although I tithe to the Church and give to other charitable organizations, I continue to worry about making ends meet. While I know that God provides for me in so many ways, I still hold on to the idea that I need to be self-sufficient and unlike Barnabas I often stumble and simply give up trying to proclaim Jesus’ message to those who reject me.


This prayer to St. Barnabas has helped: We thank you, brother Barnabas, for your liberating work in the early church. The original Twelve called you into apostleship, then gave you the new name Barnabas, “son of encouragement.” Through controversy you opened wide the doors of the church, when not welcomed at synagogue you moved to work with gentiles. With your companionship, may I also be faithful and generous, welcoming diversity in our worldwide community. Amen.






