Praise You!*

Psalm 67

Reflection

In Psalm 67, we hear the cry "May the peoples praise you, O God; / may all the peoples praise you!" And in the first and second reading we see this exclamation coming true. In the Acts of the Apostles, Gentiles receive the good news of Jesus' death and resurrection and are brought into the early church along with their Jewish brothers and sisters. In the second reading from Revelation we are given a vision of the holy city, Jerusalem, becoming a beacon for the world that all nations may "walk by its light". Our faith has never been a treasure to hoard and stow away. It is to be shared with all nations and peoples.

This psalm begins "May God have pity on us and bless us; / may he let his face shine upon us." After asking for blessing from the Lord it also expresses the desire that all the peoples of the world might bless the Lord in return. How do we experience blessing in our lives? What or who blesses us? What or who do we bless?

Someone is Watching and Wondering



Beads are among the earliest human ornaments; ostrich shell beads have been found in Africa which date to 10,000 BC. Over time various cultures made beads from a variety of materials such as stones, shells and clay. Interest-

ingly the English word bead is derived from the Old English noun *bede* which translates, prayer. While the exact origin of prayer beads remains uncertain, the oldest known image of beads used in a religious context dates from the 17th century BC. Hindus in India were probably the first to use prayer beads, followed by Buddhists who probably borrowed the concept from Hinduism. Hindu holy men with beads dates to the third century BC.

Prayer beads are used today by members of various religious traditions including Hinduism, Buddhism, Christianity, Islam, and Sikhism, to mark the repetitions of prayers, chants or devotions. The number of beads varies by religion or use. Hindus and Buddhists use the Japa Mala which usually has 108 beads, Islamic prayer beads called Misbaha or Tasbeeh usually have 100, while our Dominican rosary, adopted in the 19th century, has 59. Eastern Orthodox Christians use a knotted prayer rope called a komboskini or chotki with 100 knots that is used to pray the Jesus prayer and the Episcopal Church in the United States use a rosary with 33 beads to represent the years of Jesus' life. In each tradition the beads are fingered in an automatic manner, allowing the individual to keep track of how many prayers have been said with a minimal amount of conscious effort and provides one the ability to focus more on the actual prayers rather than the repetitions.

Each year before the first Sunday of Advent, our St. James Knights of Columbus present rosaries to individuals participating in the RCIA. At the time of presentation, several members of the RCIA team lead the catechumens and candidates in praying the rosary, emphasizing not simply the prayers, but the focus of meditating on the life of Christ. For several years Pat and Glenn Ahlfield have embraced this ministry of teaching others how to pray and meditate on the twenty mysteries of the rosary and I might add are both enthusiastic in explaining the rubrics as well as prayerful leading the meditations and responses of the rosary. Although there is no prescribed time to pray the rosary, its sequence of meditations and repetitive prayers remains perfect for the Advent Season as we prepare ourselves to once again receive and renew our relationship with Christ.

Just a FYI... I wanted to share some expenses with you.

With all the rain - well now we are in grass cutting mode.

Our grass cutting base contract is \$21,690.

We also have the payroll expense all year round. School staff, teachers and office personal, are paid on a year round base. So payroll runs approximately \$152,000/month.

Also the buildings' utilities run all summer long, while deep cleaning, maintenance and summer activities happen.

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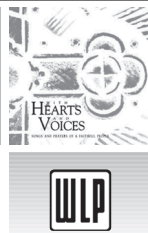
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
