

Despite difficulties with the mud we have finished the efis on the back (Eastern) portion of the church. The two upper windows, including the wood, will be replaced with stained glass. The ground will be graded north to south for runoff.

From the left, the first two glass panels will provide light into the Parish Hall. The third panel with a door will serve as entry to the church from the rear parking lot when the concrete walkway is completed. The fourth panel, as well as the east facing corner panel will provide natural light to a conference room.

If you have been wondering what all these windows were about, now you know. As you can see, we are progressing aggressively to complete the back side of the building.

A 🎵 from the Liturgy/Music Office



Reflection

The ascension is not so much about a physically present Jesus floating up and up into the clouds as it is a theologically sophisticated concept proclaiming his eternal presence with the Father in Glory. When we take this image too literally we miss the theological truth it attempts to convey. We are reminded that rising with Christ is rising to new Life, no longer to be the subject of death. Rising with Christ is rising to glory with the Father, which is much more profound than flying wingless through the sky!

Once again the psalm for today calls for all the peoples of the world to "clap your hands, / shout to God with cries of gladness." For the Lord is not Lord of Israel alone, but of "all the earth." We are also given the image "God mounts His throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord!" Today's feast of the Ascension calls for joy, even though it marks a transition from Christ's earthly ministry to his reign at the right hand of God. How do we experience the risen Lord in our lives? Can cultivate even MORE joy in this relationship?

You have made us witnesses
to all the earth, O God,
to announce the message:
Do not fear, for Christ is risen!
For this may we never cease to praise you.
Sing praise to God, sing praise.
Alleluia!
All people of God, sing hymns of praise.
Alleluia!

Someone is Watching and Wondering



One consistent theme throughout the RCIA journey is an emphasis on the "sacramental principle" or becoming "sacramental people." Fr. Michael Himes suggests that the sacramental principle is the heart of the Catholic understanding of the Christian tradition. To elaborate further he states that "If something is always and everywhere the case, it must be noticed, accepted and celebrated somewhere, sometime. What is always true must be noticed as true at a particular time and in a particular place. Thus in creation, all of which is grounded in grace, those points – persons, things, places, events, and actions - which cause us to notice the presence of grace are what we speak of as sacraments." In other words, anything which exists in the universe may be a sacrament and if we truly behold what is really present, what we see and experience through our senses, rather than what we expect, hope, fear, or desire, we will in fact discover the infinite presence and power of God and His grace, thus becoming sacramental people. "The sacramental principle, [therefore,] means that God is present to humankind and that we respond to grace through the ordinary and everyday events of life. God's spirit and humankind work together through nature and creation, through culture and society, through our minds and bodies, hearts and souls, through our labors and efforts, creativity and generativity, in the depth of our own being and in community with others, through the events and experiences that come our way, through what we are doing and what is 'going on' around us, through everything and anything of life. Life in the world is sacramental – the medium of God's outreach and human response." (Thomas H. Groom, C21 Resourses, 2012)

I think, as Christians we should all strive to become more fully sacramental people. It is my hope that each and every person who undertakes the RCIA journey will come to understand, embrace, and become beholders of God's grace in their ordinary day to day living.
