Annual Mission Cooperation Appeal We Welcome Fr. Greg Schmitt Next Weekend





A from the Liturgy/Music Office



A Commentary

In 2011, Pope Benedict XVI used his weekly General Audience to explain how Psalm 110 foreshadows the incarnation of Jesus Christ as messiah, king and high priest.

He said that the Church reads this Psalm as a prophecy of Christ, the messianic king and eternal priest, risen from the dead and seated at the right hand of the Father.

Psalm 110 is one of the best known of the psalms and begins with the declaration, "The Lord says to my lord: 'Sit at my right hand until I make your enemies your footstool.'"

The Church calls Psalm 110 royal because it initially referred to the Davidic monarchy of the Old Testament but it also simultaneously paves the way for Jesus Christ.

"From ancient times, the mysterious third verse of the Psalm has been interpreted as a reference to the king's divine sonship, while the fourth verse speaks of him as 'a priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek,' Pope Benedict said, explaining the short structure of the psalm, which runs only seven verses. The final verses of the Psalm present the triumphant King as executing judgment over the nations."

He then said that the Psalm's prophecy "is accomplished and the priesthood of Melchizedek is completed," in the death, resurrection and ascension of Christ, "because it is rendered absolute and eternal, a reality that knows no sunset."

Pope Benedict summed up Psalm 110 as an invitation to look at Jesus Christ to "understand the meaning of true kingship, which is to be lived as service and the giving of self, following a path of obedience and love 'to the end.'"

Someone is Watching and Wondering



A frequent point of discussion for participants in the RCIA relates our role as Catholics to societal concerns. There are many ministries within our parish that fall into this category

such as serving meals at St. James and St. Mary's food kitchens, supporting Hillcrest Ministries, donating food and hygiene products to outreach programs, providing assistance through the Advent Giving Tree, and the Back-Pack program to name just a few. However, the deeper question seems to be: what is our role in reaching out to immigrants waiting at our southern boarder, women, children, and families in countries across the globe who are caught in the vicious cycle of war, poverty, disease, homelessness, and violence? What is our response to children in this country who are sexually, physically and emotionally abused; who do not have access to regular, nutritious meals; who do not have a safe place to live, access to medical care or safe places to play and enjoy nature? Sometimes it seems all too easy to close our eyes, minds and hearts and pretend these conditions do not exist or to simply state, "I do all that I can already."

The above picture was taken on February, 17, 2016, when Pope Francis walked up a ramp lined with yellow flowers, to a platform facing across a fence toward the USA, located on the banks of the Rio Grande in Juarez, Mexico. Here he prayed for migrants who died trying to cross into the United States and blessed hundreds gathered only a few yards from El Paso on the other side. Pope Francis called life facing migrants as "human tragedy" and that the world must face the crisis generated by people crossing deserts, mountains, and inhospitable zones, by whatever means necessary, to flee violence and poverty. He called it a global phenomenon that can no longer be measured in numbers and statistics, but rather one we must measure with names, stories, and families. He called people forced to migrate our "brothers and sisters excluded as a result of poverty, violence, drug trafficking and criminal organizations." Pope Francis' continued pleas for each of us to care for the poor are words which make me feel uncomfortable and a call for me to follow Jesus' example and teaching of love for one another.

In closing I want to share a prayer used for the closing of a meeting I recently attended: "Christ has no body now on earth but yours; yours are the only hands with which He can do His work; yours are the only feet with which He can go about the world; yours are the only eyes through which His compassion can shine forth upon a troubled world. Christ has no body on earth not but yours and mine." Together we can do His work.

Take A Tour Of Our St. James School

Our parish's largest ministry and yet most hidden gem is our school. If you've ever thought that Catholic education might be an option for your family, but you don't begin to know how to go about it, or you think it must just be too expensive to even consider, why not give us a second look?

Our school staff has volunteered to give pop-up tours of the school this summer, to show off what they do each week, and chat with you about whether this might be a good fit for your child. You don't need to register ahead of time, just meet up with our staff at the table in the narthex – can't miss the table as it's wearing a school uniform skirt! Or you can call the school directly at 816-781-4428 and get more info or schedule a private tour.

Please keep in mind as you tour that summertime is when all schools do their deep cleaning, make the maintenance repairs that would be disruptive during the school year, and put that shiny coat of wax on the floors, so expect to see a little organized mess. We think you can see around the boxes to visualize what it's like during the year! If you are concerned that the cost would be prohibitive, give Jen Smith, our principal, a chance to give you a realistic estimate of what it costs the average family to send their children here. You might be surprised at how affordable it is. There's no commitment to the tour, we promise not to send you daily spammy emails, and we understand that this isn't the right fit for all families, but we appreciate the opportunity to see if it might be the right fit for your child.



St. Paul was the Apostle of the Gentiles. His letters are included in the writings of the New Testament, and through them we learn much about his life and the faith of the early Church.

In the year 395, St. Augustine of Hippo said of Sts. Peter and Paul: "Both apostles share the same feast day, for these two were one; and even though they suffered on different days, they were as one. Peter went first, and Paul followed. And so we celebrate this day made holy for us by the apostles' blood."
