

Someone is Watching and Wondering



I hope you don't mind if this week I continue on a theme I began last week: human suffering, throughout the world. Today, as we approach the July

4th Holiday, we remember the birth of our nation, the wisdom and initiative of the Founding Fathers, and the sacrifices of ordinary men and women who fought for freedom and equality. Unfortunately the Revolutionary War did not bring about an end to human suffering, violence, bigotry, and hatred nor did it insure protection for the vulnerable, lonely, forgotten and voiceless individuals who are still in our midst today. Yet this powerful image reminds me God is present and leading each of us to love and carry out His work.

Tragedy always seems to bring out the best in people as witnessed by the outpouring of assistance to those in need as a result of recent meteorological events in our country. Also like me, many of you still have vivid memories of September 11, 2001. We witnessed great tragedy but also great outpourings of love and caring. Many firstresponders still suffer with terrible disease as a result of 9-11 and people of faith continue to offer help and compensation. It seems, however, that we forget ordinary people who suffer daily through no fault of their own or some as a result of a great tragedy. These faceless, nameless people want the same things in life that the colonists fought for in 1776, a safe place to live, food for their family, representation and a voice in government, education, good health, dignity, and respect. Perhaps they just need a helping hand to get started on the right path, an encouraging face to welcome them, and an opportunity to reach their full potential.

I have been very blessed in my life and able to grow through others who offered me opportunities. I hope I have been able to help others find opportunities in their lives, follow their dreams, and grow in faith and love. I offer a prayer of hope that was given to me during one of the low points in my life: "My life is but a weaving between my Lord and I. I haven't chosen the colors, He knew what they should be. For He can view the pattern upon the upper side, while I can see it only, on this, the under side. Sometimes He wove in sorrow, which did seem strange to me, but I trusted in His judgement and worked on faithfully. 'Tis He who filled the shuttle; He knows just what is best, so I have to weave in earnest and leave with Him the rest. Not till the loom is silent, and shuttles cease to fly, shall God unroll the canvas and explain the reason why. The dark threads are as needful, in the weaver's skillful hand, as the threads of gold and silver in the pattern He has planned.'



2018 - 2019 Joy: Jesus, Others, Yourself

Who Will Spread The Word?

(Gospel Luke 9:51-62)

When Jesus and his disciples are turned away from a Samaritan village, the disciples want to send down fire to punish them. Jesus rebukes them and continues on the journey. As various people approach Jesus asking to be disciples, he points out the difficult choices they will have to make if they want to follow him. "No one who puts a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God."

Our faith is not just a Sunday endeavor. Being a follower of Jesus is a lifetime, 24/7 commit-



ment. It affects what we say, what we do and how we view the world Being a Christian is not easy.

Christians don't distinguish between "them" and "us." They believe that all people are God's children, and are worthy of respect. Christians realize that a person's worth is not determined by how pleasant he or she is or by how much he or she is liked. Christians turn the other cheek. They don't plot revenge. Christians go out of their way to help anyone who crosses their path. They see every living person as their brother or sister. They see all of creation as gift to be appreciated and protected.

The job description can sometimes seem overwhelming. That is why we can take comfort in the way Jesus responded to his disciples when they wanted to destroy the city that refused them hospitality. God is very patient with us.

God is understanding, even when we fail or act most unchristian. God only asks us to make an effort each day, to ask for help when we need it and to say we are sorry when we mess up.
