

*Reflection*

In the gospel Jesus sends his disciples out on mission with a list of what they are not to take: "no money bag, no sack, no sandals." In fact, they will be "like lambs among wolves." But this is no reason for distress. The psalmist sings a hymn to God's strength and deliverance: "Come and see the works of God, / his tremendous deeds among the children of Adam." Though the disciples are sent without material possessions, they go with the love of God whose "enemies cringe" before his "great strength."

In the life of faith we are at times asked to do the seemingly impossible. To love people who do not show love for us. The God of all love, compassion and strength is with us. How do we proclaim this good news with our lives?

**Someone is Watching and Wondering**



For many, today is the final day of the 4th of July Holiday, so I thought it might be fun to look back to 1776. Although July 4th is the traditional day for celebrating the birth of our nation, and Thomas Jefferson is known as the author of the Declaration of Independence, this tradition does not match the facts. In actuality it was Richard Henry Lee of Virginia who proposed that the colonies break with England on June 7, 1776. Though the idea for separating from England had been debated by the colonists for several years, the thought of finally taking this step was met with shock by the Continental Congress. Like any "good" political body the delegates decided to postpone the vote for a month, during which time, a committee of five congressmen (Thomas Jefferson, Benjamin Franklin, John Adams, Robert R. Livingston, and Roger Sherman) were appointed to write the Declaration of Independence. Point of fact, Jefferson did most of the writing with suggestions from Adams and Franklin.

The date for the vote was July 1st but only nine colonies supported the break in this "unofficial vote." By the time of the "official vote" on July 2nd, twelve of the thirteen colonies voted yea, with New York abstaining and promising to cast a favorable vote within a few days.

For the next two days, Congress polished the language, and the document was officially adopted on July 4th, with only two men, President of Congress John Hancock and his secretary, Charles Thomson, actually signing the document that day. It wasn't until August 2, 1776 that the majority of the signers affixed their signatures. Believe it or not, Congress sneakily backdated some official records to indicate that all fifty-six men had signed our Declaration of Independence on July 4th. Some actually signed as late as 1781. History isn't always neat, tidy, or honest. Hopefully, however, you have had an enjoyable 4th of July holiday and believe in the principles on which our nation was founded, and continue to believe in the self-evident truth that all people are created equal by our loving God.



### Spotlight on St. James School

#### First Grade:

**"Ready, Set, Explore!"**

In first grade we explore how insects live in communities and how that relates to our classroom communities. Studying about the life of children in Colonial times and Native American culture at the Deanna Rose Farmstead help to support our social studies and science standards. This activity also helps to encourage the understanding of diversity in other cultures and in our school.
