



A 🎵 from the Liturgy/Music Office



Reflection

It's so easy for us to be consumed by activities, checking boxes, crossing items off lists. There can be great satisfaction in acting this way and a tremendous sense of accomplishment. But in this story we hear a different message with other priorities. Rather that busy ourselves, it is the proper role of a disciple to listen to Jesus' instruction, to spend time in prayer, or with Scripture, coming to know the person of Jesus in a better way.

Our verse from Psalm 15 for this weekend is in respond to a question: "Lord, who may abide in your tent? / Who may dwell on your holy mountain?" In the first reading and in the Gospel, Abraham, Sarah, Mary, and Martha all have an intimate encounter with God where they offer hospitality to the Lord. In a way they are "abiding in God's tent." The psalmist tells us that those who are upright, truthful, and just are the ones who will dwell with the Lord. We, also, are invited to abide with God. How do you put the traits of uprightness, truthfulness, justice into practice in your own life?

Prayer

O God, you send us angels in disguise, our anxiety distracts us from seeing them.
Teach us to be both Mary and Martha that we may be ready to be present to you.
Blessed are they with generous hearts, for they shall see God,
Amen.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



RCIA gatherings provide a time to learn, understand and apply the teachings of Jesus to our daily lives. These times together help individuals understand that following Christ is all about relationships: forming those relationships with God, family, friends and community. I think a central teaching of

Jesus which describes relationships is His teaching on prayer; primarily His teaching the disciples how to pray with these words:

I know each of you is very familiar with this prayer and perhaps pray it daily. Have you, however, taken time recently to truly consider these words in relation to your daily living.

To begin, we pray personally, calling for "our father," not some far off, remote deity but rather using a very familiar, relational

Our Father, who art in heaven, Hallowed be thy Name, Thy kingdom come.

Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses. As we forgive those who trespass against w. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

form or address, abba in Aramaic, which translates as a form or endearment, papa or daddy. We complete this introduction by acknowledging the Father's holiness and our desire to live in His kingdom, not simply in heaven but here, now on earth. I think the next words, perhaps are difficult for most of us. We ask for God's will to prevail and not our own. These words imply that we are willing to let go or our own desires and let God be God. Perhaps imbedded in this phrase is a concern: "How do I know it's God's will and not simply rationalizing my thoughts, words, and deeds as being faithful to His will?" Next we petition for God to provide for and forgive us. However, there appears to be a condition for these requests; that is we must also forgive one another. Finally, and once again there is a problem with the request; we ask God to "lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil." You might well ask, "Where is the difficulty with this expression?" I think we should all rethink this phrase in light of the first Chapter of the Letter of James. I want to close here and leave you with this puzzling question. This week read these verses with an open mind and heart, pondering the words, and discover why I might suggest that "lead us not into temptation" is possibly misunderstood when we pray the Lord's Prayer.





Thursday July 25 Feast Day of St. James the Greater The Patron Saint of Our Church



The son of Zebedee and Salome, "our" St. James is called "the Greater" to distinguish him from the Apostle James "the Less", who was probably shorter of stature. He was the brother of John, the beloved disciple. Zebedee, his father, was a fisherman of the Sea of Galilee. Salome, his mother, was one of the pious women who afterwards followed Christ and "ministered unto him of their substance.

James is described as one of the first disciples to join Jesus. When he first encountered Jesus, there probably was no indication that this was the day that his life would change. The dawn for him was not the bright beginning of a new day, but the end of long fruitless night of fishing. As James sat mending his nets in the boat with his brother John and his father Zebedee, he must have watched in wonder as his partner Simon brought in nets loaded with fish he had caught at the command of Jesus.

James was one of only three apostles whom Jesus selected to bear witness to his Transfiguration.

The Acts of the Apostles records that "herod the king" (traditionally identified with Herod Agrippa) had James executed by sword. He is the only apostle whose martyrdom is recorded in the New Testament.

Spotlight on St. James School

Third Grade: "Earthkeepers!"

In 3rd Grade we focus on caring for ourselves, supporting each other, and embracing God's creations. Our daily lessons encompass rich academic opportunities to prepare our students to be stewards of God's gifts. One main focus is how people interact with each other in a community. Third graders become entrepreneurs who learn to run successful businesses on "Market Day." This is a favorite activity for our classes, as they have a hand at being both producers and consumers.

Then we shift our focus to learn how our actions and decisions affect animals and organisms in the world around us. This year, we introduced vermicomposting to our classrooms. Students were able to experience hundreds of worms taking our daily food waste and turning it back into nutrient enriched earth.

Our study trips allow us to interact with our environment and truly discover the symbiotic relationships that keep Earth running smoothly. These real-life experiences make strong connections that the kids carry with them throughout their lives. 
