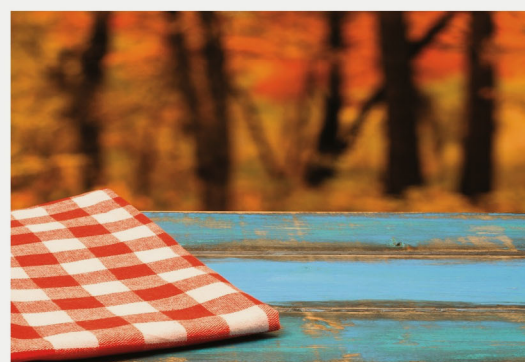
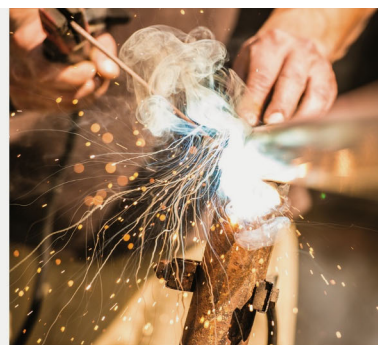

Reflection

We have two lessons from today's reading: humble oneself and serve those who cannot reciprocate. There is certainly more to the entire gospel message than that, but it is an excellent place to start. Moreover, both can be done in imitation of Jesus himself, who truly humbled himself and served us, we who cannot truly reciprocate. In the gospel Jesus describes a banquet that might have been very different from the dinner he is attending at the home of one of the most prominent Pharisees.

The banquet he envisions is populated not with distinguished and honored but with those who are too often invisible in society: "the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind." Could this be an image of the heavenly banquet table? The psalmist sings of a God who is "father of orphans and the defender of widows," who "gives a home to the forsaken, / he leads forth prisoners to prosperity."

In God's eyes, the people who are pushed to the margins of society are loved, precious, and worthy of the kingdom of God. Do we invite them to our banquet tables?

AMEN.

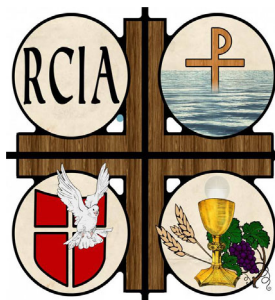

Someone is Watching and Wondering



What was Jesus talking about at the last supper when he said "This is my body?" I believe Jesus was referring to more than the bread. He was talking about the loving, caring community gathered with Him, sharing a meal in solidarity. He was speaking of their time together, words spoken of truth, love, kindness, and He was speaking of Himself as teacher and healer. In essence He was talking about the body of Christ and the reality of unconditional love. Bill Huebsch (in his book *Rethinking Sacraments*) writes that the last supper was about more than bread and wine, blessed and shared; "it was a paschal life and a paschal death. It was a person's life given for others and a new way of eating and drinking that would last forever." He later states: "The Body of Christ for Jesus and the early followers was clearly the community of God. Each time a reference [in scripture] is made to the body and its parts, it is a reference not to bread but to people. Even at the Lord's Supper itself it isn't simply bread, it is bread broken. It isn't just wine, it is wine poured out. So our reverence must be, not simply for bread, but for bread broken, shared, inclusive of all, the body of Christ, us, them, everyone." Reverence for His body must be reverence for all humanity: the poor, the homeless, the sinner. We cannot truly reverence the Body of Christ until we serve "wash each other's feet."

Before we receive the Body and Blood of Christ we affirm our belief in Christ and His Gospel with a strong, AMEN. Our amen affirms the goodness of creation, the joy of being human, the humility of accepting grace, receiving and giving unconditional love, and the understanding that we become what we consume. When we receive we are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ, freely giving ourselves and our lives to God, and graciously loving and serving one another. Our call to ministry, like the disciples, is rooted in the washing of feet. This act is a call to reconciliation, healing and ministry. For John embracing the Body of Christ is rooted in this moment, the great *mandatum* when we are each called to serve. When we take and eat, take and drink we beg to become what we receive; we beg to walk in His footsteps; we beg to following His teachings; we beg Him to lead us in continuing His work.

For me this is the essence of receiving the Sacrament of the Eucharist. We are begging to be transformed. Eucharist is the sacrament of the heart. Receiving the Eucharist is a coming home, through Christ, to ourselves and one another. Jesus told Peter, if you love me "feed my sheep." The Eucharist, therefore, is about receiving, being transformed, and giving.
