


# Do You Know?

## From the Pastor's Pen

This weekend I will join my family for our annual gathering. My six siblings and their spouses make this time together a priority, as we enjoy a very close relationship and need this time together to nurture our family bonds. Each year we choose a different location because we are spread all across the country with one sister living in Berlin, Germany. This year we are meeting in our home town, Nebraska City, Nebraska

Pope Francis has made the fostering of family life a priority in his teachings and writings. In a recent exhortation he answered the question: "What makes a family holy." There are many ways this guestion could be answered, but he narrowed it down to three actions. First, that the family prays together. He notes that this is a great challenge for modern families because family members are involved in so many activities. Yet prayer can be as simple as an Our Father or brief Scripture reading around the table at mealtime; it could be a decade of the rosary; it could be the practice of parents praying night prayer with small children or a blessing for teenagers as they go to an activity. The second action would be keeping the faith, making faith a treasure to be nurtured and passed on. The faith is not just doctrine, but faith put into practice. Parents need to show their children by example how the corporal works of mercy are lived. Finally, Pope Francis says that a holy family experiences joy. Where does that joy come from? From positive attitudes, from compliments, from mutual respect.

We could extend the question of Pope Francis "What makes a holy family," to "What makes a holy parish family?" The same three suggestions apply. Let us all strive to make St. James Parish holy ground with holy people.

## Someone is Watching and Wondering



Of the seven great sacraments I think the one most difficult to understand, especially for fellow Christians, raised in a Protestant tradition who desire to be in full communion with the Catholic Church, is the Sacrament of Reconciliation. I might even hazard to guess that it is the sacrament misunderstood by many

Catholics, especially as this sacrament is combined with the Sacrament — Anointing of the Sick, as a sacrament of healing.

Let me begin unpacking the Sacrament of Reconciliation with a quote from the introduction to the Rite of Penance: "The whole Church, as a priestly people, acts in different ways in the work of reconciliation that has been entrusted to it by the Lord. Not only does the Church call sinners to repentance by preaching the word of God, but it also intercedes for them and helps penitents with the maternal care and solicitude to acknowledge and confess their sins and to obtain the mercy of God, who alone can forgive sins. Further, the Church becomes itself the instrument of the conversion and absolution of the penitent through the ministry entrusted by Christ to the apostles and their successor." In other words, the ministry of reconciliation, rooted in God's word, is that of the whole Church, each of us as people of faith, and brothers and sisters in Christ, are called to provide and nurture an environment that reconciles and forgives. This is a very logical statement if we understand that sin is not only about breaking a sacred bond with God but also a sacred bond with others. Sin is all about hurting others with our words, actions, and inactions; "What I have done and what I have failed to do." If on the other hand sin is only about healing my relationship with God, then there is no logical reason for this sacrament. I simply confess directly to God, and I am assured of His grace and forgiveness. If, however, I understand sin as a radical injustice or harm that I have done to you, as well as an obstacle that I have placed in my relationship with God, then the sacrament takes on a much deeper, richer meaning and I understand the need for its communal nature. According to Fr. Liam Kelly, in his book Sacraments Revisited, What do they mean today, "The basis for our attitude to sin is relationships: our relationship to ourselves, to others, and to God. Sin is manipulation of others and of God for our own self-interest." Sin is allowing our ego-centered self to take over and control our actions, rather than seeking quidance to lead us in true Christian fellowship and love; the path of *agape*. Recognizing the communal nature of sin makes it easier to understand the Sacrament of Reconciliation as a liturgical action of the entire community and its need in our individual lives.



## Did You Know?

Did you know that the Catholic Bible and the Protestant Bible are different? There are 73 books in the Catholic Bible, while the Protestant Bible contains 66 books. You ask, "How can this be? A Bible is a Bible, right?" In a Protestant Bible, you will not find seven books found in the Old Testament of the Catholic Bible - Tobit, Judith, 1 and 2 Maccabees, Wisdom, Sirach, and Baruch. First century Christians, including Jesus and the Apostles, often quoted from the Septuagint, a Greek translation of the Hebrew Scriptures that contained these books. By the end of the 4th century, the canon of the Bible was settled by the Church with all 73 books of the Bible considered to be "inspired". The Bible of this time is identical to what the Catholic Bible contains today. However, in the 16th century the seven books listed above were labeled "unscriptural" and dropped from the Protestant Bible during the Protestant Reformation led by Martin Luther because these seven books contradicted some of the elements of Protestant doctrine. 

# What does it mean to tithe?

At St. James School, parents can either fulfill a tithe yearly, or pay tuition costs directly to the school. Your tithe may be applied to your child's education at St. James if:

- You are a registered family at St. James Church. (Your family name will be in the church directory if you are registered and you will have an envelope number.)
- You are current with your tithe. (You contribute a set amount you determine on a pledge card submitted to the church office by use of envelopes or automatic withdrawal from account.) This pledge is required to be fulfilled each year as our church budget relies on it. Pledge year runs January 1 - December 31.
- You are active parishioners, attending Sunday Mass weekly and receive Sacraments regularly.
