Mission Statement



From the Pastor's Pen

Probably most Catholics are familiar with the term "stigmata." It refers to the occurrence of wounds that marked the sufferings of Jesus. He was placed on the cross, secured by nails driven through his hands (some believe it would rather be through the wrists) and his feet. A crown of thorns was placed on his head. After the resurrection, when Jesus appeared to the apostles, it is recorded that the wound marks remained. John 20:27: "Put your finger here and see my hands and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving but believe." Those wound marks led Thomas to say in belief: "My Lord and My God."

Down through the ages there have been many claims of the stigmata by both men and woman, claiming that they bear the wound marks of Christ. Perhaps the most well-known of these is St. Francis of Assisi. As St. Bonaventure testified: "Because of this new and astounding miracle, Francis came down from the mountain (Alverno) a new man, adorned with the sacred stigmata, bearing in his body the image of Christ crucified."

My reason for bringing up this topic is because this Monday, September 23, the Church celebrates the feast of St. Pio of Pietrelcina, better known as "Padre Pio." He was born in a small town in southern Italy of very pious and poor parents. He appeared to be a very special person, even at a young age, experiencing heavenly visions and ecstasies. At the age of 15 he applied to enter the formation program for the Capuchin religious order. Despite many trials with the need for special tutoring and health issues, he persevered and was ordained as a Capuchin priest. Already in the early days of his priesthood, he began to experience pain and bleeding, especially in the areas of his hands and feet. He had a great devotion to the mystical body of Christ. It became apparent that the flow of blood from his hands and feet could be associated with the stigmata. He suffered great pain and would need to wrap his hands with cloths in order to celebrate Mass. He died at the age of 81 in 1968 and was canonized as a saint in 2002. Even during his lifetime his wounds were scrutinized by medical doctors and psychologists. Some have expressed doubts about the authenticity of the stigmata and yet he continues to be much honored by many who turn to him in supplication. We join the universal Church in honoring his memory this Monday.


Knights of Columbus 5th Sunday Breakfast Next Sunday

Reflection

Amos's emphasis on care of the poor is echoed in Psalm 113. Not only is God "High above all nations," but he also "raises up the lowly from the dust; / from the dunghill he lifts up the poor / to seat them with princes, / with the princes of his own people." Though today's gospel reading does not focus specifically on the plight of the poor, as next Sunday's will, we can see within it the roots of economic prudence. Wealth and riches can enslave a person who entrusts himself entirely to them. Instead, with God as the true master, wealth can take up its proper post, as a gift to be shared with others, especially those most in need. Today's psalm is good news for all who identify with, befriend, or care for the poor. To proclaim this psalm well, you must live it! How do you relate to the poor within your community?

Children's Choir

As parents well know, a child's behavior is often contagious. In our Children's Choir, which leads the music twice a month on Saturday evenings, this contagious behavior has proven to be a blessing. The middle school students who support our choir, model examples of good behavior at Mass, and the younger students mimic that behavior. With hearts and voices lifted to God, our middle school students model for the younger students full participation in Mass. The choir as a whole then models full participation to our parish congregation. Parents, do you model full participation in Mass as well?



Someone is Watching and Wondering



For the past two weeks I have attempted to provide a fresh, less fearful interpretation of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. In the first reflection I mentioned that the Sacrament of Reconciliation is grouped with The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick as one of the two sacraments of healing. So today I want to shift focus to the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick providing a new understanding as a sacrament not only of healing but a sacrament of **Hope**.

Quoting Juliet in Shakespeare's play *Romeo and Juliet* "a rose by any other name would smell as sweet," you may wonder what this quote has to do with the Sacrament and my answer is everything. Previously most people referred to Anointing of the Sick as "last rites" or "extreme unction." Given this name it was understood that the individual being anointed was near death. Our understanding, however, has changed along with the name; the sacrament is no longer designated "Last Rites" rather Anointing of the Sick. You might ask, "So what?" Let me elaborate. Common reactions to suffering or prolonged illness are "Why is this happening; when will the hurt go away?" The medical community attempts to answer these questions with interventions designed to minimize pain and foster healing. On the other hand, the sacrament of the sick offers spiritual support and a way of coping; Christ's presence strengthens the afflicted. Looking to sacred scripture there are many examples of Jesus' ministry of healing: the paralytic lowered through the roof, blind Bartimaeus, the deaf mute, the woman with the hemorrhage and so many more. We also read in Luke's Gospel (9:1-2) that Jesus entrusted the power to heal to his disciples and in the Letter of James: "Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint [him] with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person" (5:13-15). The Church's roots of anointing, therefore, are found in Jesus' teachings and the ministry of the early Church.

For me the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is a sacrament of peace and hope. I have received this sacrament on several occasions. One experience very vivid in my mind occurred when I was scheduled to have a procedure involving my cervical spine. Needless to say I was anxious not only regarding the procedure but also about the outcome. I asked Fr. Tom Albers if he would administer the sacrament to me. I have no scientific explanation but I felt very calm after being anointed and my anxiety was gone. I know God's spirit was with me and with the physician who completed the procedure. I still have pain, but through the sacrament I continue to feel God's peace.

Stewardship of Treasure

Just to keep you informed on some of our expenses.

Two HVAC units in the current parish office building went out in July. The upstairs unit was repaired (\$1,064) before it was replaced. The cost of both systems came to a total of \$7,842. A total of \$8,906 in less than 6 weeks. You may wonder why spend the money on new units? The current office space will be the home of our Resource Center as the offices move to the lower level of the Church building. We will have 8 meeting rooms and a "library area" available for parishioners to request and reserve.

The storm damage from August 15: HVAC units \$13,085 and roof damage \$12,126. Some of these costs will be reimbursed by insurance coverage.

The black top and stripping of current parking lot: \$28,380

Some of these have been paid; some are coming up; some will be reimbursed.



The first prayer that Jesus taught His disciples is what we have come to know as "The Lord's Prayer" or "Our Father". The one and perfect prayer given to us by our Lord Jesus Christ appears twice in the Bible in the Gospel of Luke (11:2-4) in a shorter version and in the Gospel of Matthew (6:9-13) in a longer version. As Catholics, we pray the version found in Matthew's Gospel. Protestants pray the version in Luke's Gospel and have added an ending doxology, ("For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory forever and ever.") when saying the prayer that praises the glory of God. Thought to have come from 1 Chronicles 29:4-19 when King David exalted God, we say this doxology, not as part of the original prayer, but as a response to the prayer said following the "Our Father". 
Sacrament Preparation






