A Message From Fr. Mike

This weekend is our last celebration of the Eucharist as a total parish community in this space. We will continue to have daily Mass this week. Next Friday morning, October 18, at our All School Mass at 8:15 we will officially say good-bye to this Worship space, and, in a way, 'de-consecrate it' by removing the cross and carrying it to our new Daily Chapel in the new Church.

And so this weekend we take a moment to thank God for all the sacramental moments that have taken place in this worship space. We are grateful for the times of new life, through the celebration of the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. We are grateful for the times we gathered for God's Grace in times of suffering and pain for God's healing. We remember our loved ones who have gone us before us, and the Masses of Christian burial that have been celebrated over these past thirty-eight years. Through all those moments God has led us, and our patron, the Apostle James, has walked with us in times of joy as well as in sadness and suffering.

Leaving this church this weekend, you will receive memorial cards. On the front are the dates 1981-2019, and pictures of the beautiful stained glass windows that were designed for this building; a history of the windows is on the back. These cards, designed and carried out by Dan Bacon and Judy Keisling are great reminders of God's journey with us through all these years!

Next Saturday, October 19, we begin the ceremony of Dedication and Consecration of our new Church. We will gather in our old 'former' worship space and process to the new building where Bishop Johnston, gathered with all who have made this building possible, will begin the ceremony of Consecration.

The Bishop is handed the keys to the building by the SFS Architectural Firm and the A.L. Huber Construction Company, the firms that helped design and execute building this Church, as well as Diocesan officials and parishioners, who were key in making this day happen.

Those keys are then given to me, your pastor, to unlock the doors to begin this beautiful ceremony – consecrating this building to God through the rituals of Blessings,

and prayers of every part of the building, culminating in consecrating the altar.

After calling on the power of the Saints, especially St. James, the celebration of the Eucharist begins, led by Bishop Johnston, our Shepherd. And our community comes together for the first time in this building – now a House of God and a place of worship for our community – a pilgrim people, nourished by God's Word and the Body and Blood of Christ, who are prepared to go out and share the Good News.

One of the most beautiful elements of this Church is The mural of the Transfiguration on the wall of the sanctuary. We are reminded in this message that Jesus took the Apostles closest to him, Peter, James and John, to a high mountain where He was transfigured in their eyes. And Moses and Elijah, the most important figures of the Jewish faith, appeared with Jesus.

And the Scripture says, the voice of God proclaims, 'This is my Beloved Son, Listen to Him'. The mural is a reminder to our St James community to always listen to the call of God in our lives.

As we make this transition into a new place of worship, may we continue to be good and faithful stewards of God's gifts and may we continue to be welcoming and hospitable to all during this transition.

As we change the Sunday Mass times, we realize that it will take time to adjust to this transition. Let us be patient with one another. The style of the Church will call us to re-adjust as we find a new 'place'. The pews are much longer, so if we sit at the end of pew, may we be welcoming of others needing a place to sit.

Thanks again for making this building possible, and may we be grateful to God for this journey and to the power of God's Spirit leading us to be good and faithful stewards to 'continue the Good Work that God has begun among us'.



Someone is Watching and Wondering



How did you learn about Jesus? Was it a personal experience or did someone teach you?

Did your family share Bible stories, read scripture, and pray together? Did you attend Church, go to Sunday school or religious education during the week? Most of us answered that our family

shared stories, prayed, went to church, and sent us (as children) to some type of religious schooling. I know that I didn't suddenly know about God and Jesus by sitting alone and pondering, rather so many adults in my life passed on their beliefs. Over time I begin to formulate my own understanding of what it means to be a Christian.

There was a time in my life, however, when I found many excuses for not attending any form of religious service. I avoided church and believed that I could have a personal relationship with God outside formal worship. After all didn't God create everything that exists? Isn't God found in nature? I felt a peacefulness when I spent time walking in the woods, taking care of my gardens, watching children playing, and sitting on the shore of almost any body of water. Why did I need church?

Somehow I was lead to the answer in the Gospels, my favorite being the Gospel of John. At the last meal Jesus shared with his disciples he said: "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know you are my disciples" (13:34). I'm sure this can be interpreted many ways but to me the meaning of the passage is simple; we do not live in isolation but in community. As members within a community we are called to love and care for one another. The only way to truly love God is to accept His grace, embracing the fullness of our humanity and the humanity of all His children with love, generosity, and respect. Frankly, I cannot do this alone. I need the support of others and I have found that support in the community of Jesus' disciples, celebrating and giving thanks together, and receiving the Sacraments of the Church.

Yes, I still feel God's presence in my daily routines, alone in nature, and sitting quietly, in awe of all He continues to provide. Without gathering regularly with fellow believers, however, I think I would be in a state of perpetual hunger.

Dedication of Our New Church Saturday, October 19 - 2:30pm

Bishop Johnston will join Fr Mike and many of our previous pastors, associates and other familiar clergy as we dedicate our beautiful new church.

There will be a reception in the new parish hall, located downstairs, for all who attend.

Things You Need To Know When Attending the Dedication

Parking We anticipate that up to 1,000 people will attend the dedication. We encourage you to carpool with friends and family and come early. We have approximately 550 parking spaces and some parking will be permitted on the grassy areas. There will be parking attendants to help direct where you can park.

PLEASE NOTE: Parking behind the new church will be limited to persons with disabilities who have either a handicapped license plate or placard on their windshield.

Persons With Disabilities If you have a handicapped license plate or placard on your windshield, you may park in the parking lot behind the new church. Attendants will be available to guide you into the church. However, if you park in the back you will not be a part of the procession (see gathering below). Spaces for handicapped in front of the church may also be used but you will need to join the procession or enter the church after the procession has entered.

When You Arrive Go to the old church. We will gather there and process to the new church. The procession, complete with bagpipes and drummer will be led by Bishop Johnston, Fr. Mike, and other clergy.

PLEASE NOTE: The new church will be locked until the procession has arrived at its doors and Fr. Mike has unlocked the doors.

Entering The New Church As the procession moves into the gathering space, through the glass doors and into the church, move to your seat as quickly and efficiently as possible. Please fill the front pews first. You may wish to walk to the far side aisles for easier movement and more readily available seating. Move to the center of the pews. The Knights of Columbus will line the aisles and be available to help usher you to your seats.

PLEASE NOTE: When entering the church, do not genuflect, bow, or bless yourself with the water in the font because the water has not been blessed, the altar has not been anointed, and the tabernacle is empty.

After the Dedication We anticipate that the Dedication Service will last approximately 2 1/2 hours. Following the dedication you are cordially invited to the reception being held in the new Parish Hall on the lower level of the church. Refreshments, drinks and finger food will be served. Although seating will be limited, there will be a tent set up behind the church for overflow.

Are we not Christ's servants? Isn't it true that we really aren't worthy to receive the Body and Blood of Jesus? Just as Jesus healed the centurion's servant, we are healed in the Eucharist.




An Opportunity To Help Provide Outreach Efforts For Our RE Program




