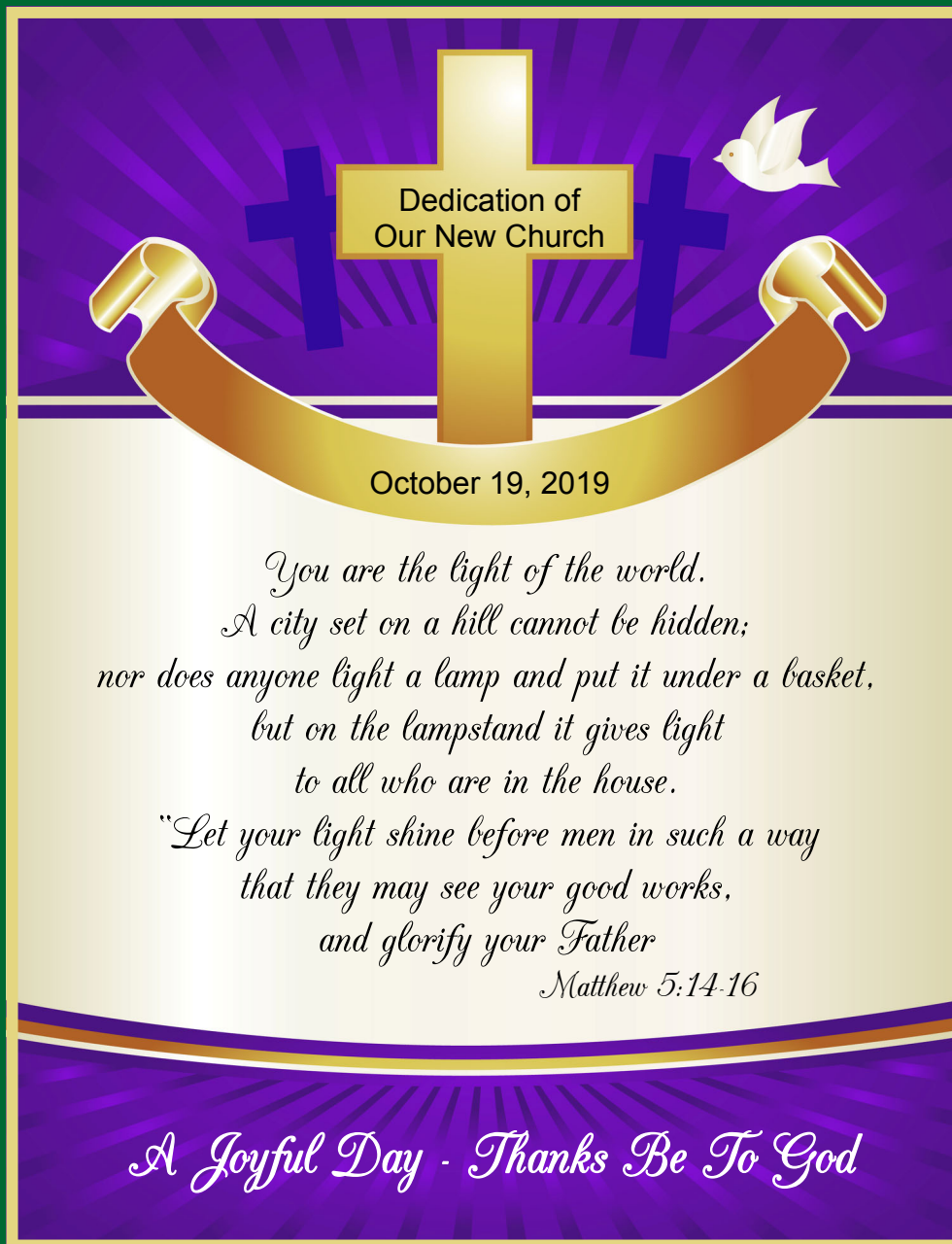

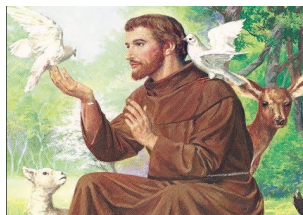

Someone is Watching and Wondering



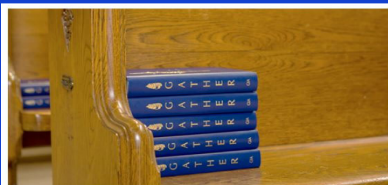
As we journey toward November 1st, I will share some thoughts on saints. My late husband, Gene, was both excited and pleased when our current Pope took the name Francis because Francis of

Assisi was Gene's favorite saint, (I think he saw some of his own traits in St. Francis) and he looked to the saint's teachings for spiritual guidance.

Francis' birth is given as 1182, although the exact date is uncertain. His Italian father was Pietro de Bernardone, a wealthy cloth merchant, and his mother was Pica de Bourlemont, a French noblewoman from Provence. Indulged by his parents, Francis lived a high-spirited life; it is told that he was handsome, witty, gallant, and delighted in fine clothes and lavish spending. Around the age of twenty he became a knight and fought against neighboring Perugia. He was taken prisoner during this military expedition and held for a year before his release was ransomed. Returning home he became seriously ill and suffered a prolonged recovery. During this time, Francis began to question his life, realizing that what had previously given him joy now seemed empty. He spent hours praying for guidance in San Damiano, an old run down church on the outskirts of town; here he experienced the calling to rebuild the Church. Francis, believing that he was being called to repair the old building, stole cloth from his father's business and sold it to acquire the funds needed for the repairs. When his father learned of his son's actions, he took Francis before the bishop who ordered Francis to return his father's goods. Not only did he return the money, but he stripped off his fine clothes, threw them at his father's feet, and proclaimed that Pietro was no longer his father, only God in heaven. Eventually Francis came to understand that rebuilding the church meant calling people back to God. Before his death, Francis became the *Poverello* (little poor one), wearing the garment of the peasants laboring in the fields, cared for lepers, became a peacemaker, founded the men's Order of Friars Minor, helped establish the women's Order of Saint Clare, and the Third Order (a way for people to live the religious life while continuing their ordinary work). He became a friar, deacon, and preacher and developed an understanding of the unity of all creation, addressing every created thing as Brother or Sister. He treated all creation reverently; stories about St. Francis tell of his belief in the beauty of creation which filled him with joy that worldly possession and pleasure could not.

Pope Francis not only took the Saint's name but seems to embrace so many of his beliefs and teachings. For me, St. Francis' teaching can also lead us to a more peaceful, joy-filled world.

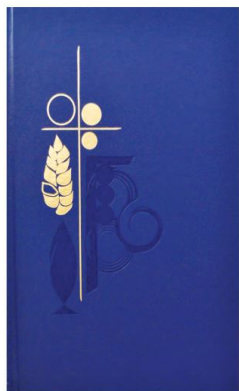

Novena To The Christ Child Begins November 11



The Novena is traditionally, a nine day devotion, however in an effort to make it easier for Parishioners to attend during the busy Christmas season, the devotion will be held one evening a week for nine weeks.

Here are the details;

WHEN - Saturdays at 6:15pm after the 5:00pm Mass. (there will be light snacks and fellowship after the devotion for anyone who cares to join in)

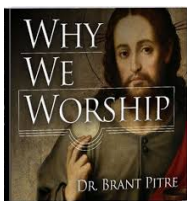
DATES - November 11, 16, 23, 30 and December 7, 14, 21, and 28. The date and time of the final devotion will be announced later.

LOCATION - Conference rooms in the newly re-modeled "Resource Center" located in the former St. James business offices.

The final evening devotion will be hosted by RC Arciga and his family with a party afterwards. R.C. prayed the "Novena To The Christ Child" while growing up in Guam with his family. He has continued the Novena devotion with his wife, Louella and their children. Prayers and traditional hymns, are both in English and the Chamorro language of Guam.

The Novena was written by a Spanish priest, Father Roman DeVera, sometime between 1904 and 1920. A multi-linguist who spoke Spanish, English, Filipino and the Chamorro language of Guam, he served Manila and Guam from 1901 to roughly 1950. He is tied to the Capuchin order that was associated with the Franciscans.

Every priest is ordained by a bishop, who was ordained by a bishop and so on in an unbroken line back to one of the Apostles. This lineage is called Apostolic Succession. We see this clearly in the Bible in Acts of the Apostles 1:15-26 where after the death of Judas, the remaining 11 Apostles had to fill the place given to Judas by Christ. 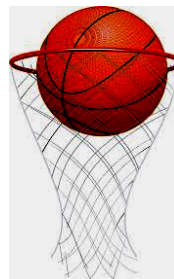

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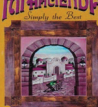
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
