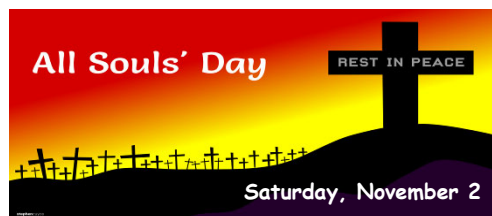

Commemoration Of The Faithful Departed



This tradition is upheld on All Souls' Day, which falls yearly on Nov. 2. It follows All Saints' Day (a Holy Day of Obligation), which is observed on Nov. 1.

While All Saints Day is a day when Catholics remember all who have already entered heaven, All Souls' Day is a day to pray for all loved ones who have died.

The Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph is committed to combatting sexual abuse in the Church. If you are a victim of sexual abuse, or if you observe or suspect sexual abuse:

From the Pastor's Pen

This coming Friday our worldwide Church family will celebrate the feast of All Saints, and on Saturday, the feast of All Souls. Each weekend and holy day when we pray the Creed we profess our belief in the Communion of the Saints. What does that mean?

It simply means that the bonds we have with each other as brothers and sisters in the Lord Jesus do not end with death. We rely on the prayerful intercession of those who have left this earthly life, those who enjoy the bliss of heaven. In some way, they intercede for us as we call upon them in prayer. Yes, they are the canonized saints, those officially recognized by the Church as models of faith. But they are also many other saintly people, perhaps like our own parents or grandparents, who have shown such great faith and who also are models of faith for us, even though not recognized in the Canon of Saints.

This great Communion of Saints also means that we, the living, can intercede on behalf of those who have died, perhaps being purified to take their place in the Kingdom of God. Somehow our prayers, joined to theirs, help them to come to the fullness of God's Kingdom. We may not understand the details of how all of this happens, but we accept the tradition and doctrine that has been handed on to us from the earliest days of the Church and has been part of our belief for many centuries.

There is another important point to be made as we celebrate All Saints Day. The teaching of the Second Vatican Council reminds us that all of God's People receive the call to holiness. It is not just priests and religious who are to strive to live a Christ-like way of life, but every disciple of the Lord has this call, this goal. In whatever our vocation may be, our work may be dedicated to the Lord for His glory and honor. Sanctity does not mean that we are perfect, but rather that we keep striving, even in our weakness, to be faithful to our calling as disciples.

May the celebration of All Saints reaffirm your desire to live the call to holiness.

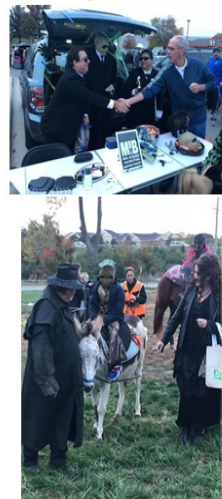

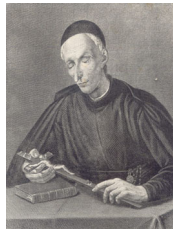
TEEN CHOIR / YOUTH BAND

Someone is Watching and Wondering



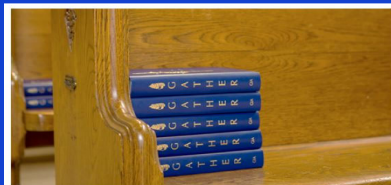
ST. JOSEPH MARIA PIGNATELLI, S.J.

Although I have been a Roman Catholic for quite some time, I have yet to discover my favorite among all the canonized saints. However, I have always been attracted to the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) I think because of their emphasis on education. The first Jesuits founded schools throughout Europe, which reflected their training in both classical studies and theology. Another emphasis of the Jesuits was evangelization and they founded missions around the globe including Paraguay, Japan, Ontario, Ethiopia and India. I must confess that I consider my education from Loyola University – New Orleans as one of the major turning points in my life. Like myself, many will recognize the name of Ignatius of Loyola as the founder of the Society of Jesus and are also aware that Pope Francis is a Jesuit. However, perhaps you are like me and have never heard the name St. Joseph Mary Pignatelli, S.J. nor know the significant role he played in restoration of the order.

St. Joseph Pignatelli was born in Spain, of Neapolitan descent and noble lineage, on December 27, 1737. He entered the Society when he was 15 years old. For political reasons, European monarchs pressured the pope into suppressing the Jesuits in the late 18th century and in 1773 Pope Clement XIV dissolved the Order completely. However, Prussia and Russia refused to carry out the papal decree allowing the Society of Jesus to survive in Russia. When the Order was suppressed in Spain, Pignatelli could have remained in his homeland, because he was a member of the Spanish nobility. Instead he chose exile with his Jesuit brothers. Maintaining a fragile existence with his brothers, Pignatelli played a significant role in reestablishment of the Society in 1707. After renewing his vows, he was appointed Novice Master, and later Provincial. In the midst of the Napoleonic wars and shifting political pressures among the small states in Italy, Pignatelli shepherded the re-founded Jesuit communities. He died in 1811 just three years before Pope Pius VII universally restored the Society. Known as restorer of the Society, St. Joseph Maria Pignatelli, it just so happens his feast day is November 28, a very important day in my life.

In reading about this saint and his role in restoring the Society of Jesus, I couldn't but wonder if Pope Francis walks in his footsteps. It seems to me that Pope Francis is very involved in restoring the Catholic Church to all the faithful, and working to reestablish Jesus' gospel to every corner of our world, for all people regardless of race, economic status, or degree of influence. St. Joseph Maria Pignatelli and Pope Francis are certainly Jesuits I can follow. Perhaps I have found my saint, at least for this year's Feast of All Saints.

Novena To The Christ Child Begins November 9



The Novena is traditionally, a nine day devotion, however in an effort to make it easier for Parishioners to attend during the busy Christmas season, the devotion will be held one evening a week for nine weeks.

Here are the details;

WHEN - Saturdays at 6:15pm after the 5:00pm Mass. (there will be light snacks and fellowship after the devotion for anyone who cares to join in)

DATES - November 9, 16, 23, 30 and December 7, 14, 21, and 28. The date and time of the final devotion will be announced later.

LOCATION - Conference rooms in the newly re-modeled "Resource Center" located in the former St. James business offices.

The final evening devotion will be hosted by R.C. Arciga and his family with a party afterwards. R.C. prayed the "Novena To The Christ Child" while growing up in Guam with his family. Prayers and traditional hymns, are both in English and the Chamorro language of Guam.

The Novena was written by a Spanish priest, Father Roman DeVera, sometime between 1904 and 1920.

A multi-linguist who spoke Spanish, English, Filipino and Chamorro, he served in Manila and Guam from 1901 to roughly 1950. He is tied to the Capuchin order that was associated with the Franciscans.

Did You Know?

There's an interesting history behind why we periodically sit, stand or kneel during Mass. Kneeling has deep roots in the history of worship. (See Psalm 95:6, Isaiah 45:23, Luke 5:8 and Philippians 2:10.) Medieval churches did not provide seating and before the Protestant Reformation, the congregation would stand or kneel during the Mass. With the Protestant Reformation and the service centered on a long sermon, the design of churches began to include pews or benches upon which the people could sit. It wasn't until much later that the Catholic Church began to include the use of pews in the nave of the church and helped those in attendance to become active participants in the Liturgy, sitting when learning, standing to show reverence and prayer during important times, such as the reading of the Gospel and specific prayers, and kneeling as a sign of reverence and humility before God. As Catholics, we worship with our whole bodies!

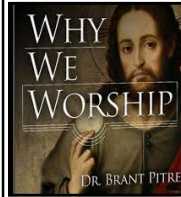

If we are going to truly trust God with all of our heart, we must set aside all those other distractions and be fully present to what God wants from us. TV, being overly busy, sports, social media and many other things that distract us are not necessarily bad, but it's when they don't allow us to fully participate in who God created us to be as his sons and daughters that it becomes a roadblock to living full lives. Let us set aside distractions so that we may live our lives to the fullest.

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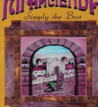
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
