## From the Pastor's Pen

This Friday, November 15, the Knights of Columbus are hosting their annual "Priest Appreciation Dinner." We are very grateful to the Knights for this occasion and for all that they do for the parish family. I want to use this occasion to give special recognition to our pastor, Fr. Mike Roach. He is a pastor in the true sense of the word, shepherding the people of the parish and the larger community of Liberty with genuine care. We especially recognize the role of Fr. Mike in the years of work in planning for the new church building, for guiding the work to its completion, and for helping the parish to assume financial responsibility with the new Capital Campaign. I don't know of any priest who could have done better work. In addition, he is always there when people need him, there for the sacraments, there for counseling and guidance. In the name of this parish family and community, I express sincere gratitude, offer our continued support, and pray for God's abundant blessing to come upon him.

In our world-wide Church family, the month of November has traditionally been celebrated as a time for remembering our deceased loved ones. As I mentioned in a previous column, we believe in the Communion of the Saints. As the ritual of the "Vigil for the Deceased" says, "We believe that all the ties of friendship and affection which knit us as on throughout our lives do not unravel with death." We keep those bonds alive with our thoughts and prayers. This doctrine of faith gives us great comfort and assurance. In some way our bond of union with them in prayer assists them as they prepare for their entrance into God's Kingdom. We celebrated "All Souls Day" in November 2nd as we began the month of prayer. Each day we place our deceased loved ones in the presence of God and remember them as great gifts to us. My own dear mother died at the young age of 53, leaving behind a beloved husband and seven grieving children. Whenever we come together, we still tell stories and remember all the ways she touched our lives. That is another way of celebrating our belief in the resurrection of the body and life everlasting. "May the souls of the faithful, departed through the mercy of God, rest in peace." The short prayer should be part of our daily prayer, but especially during this month of November.

## A from the Liturgy/Music Office



### *Reflection*

The first and second readings present communities facing distress and persecution. At the time of the Maccabees, the second century BC, the Israelites were under the rule of the Seleucid Empire, whose brutal leader, Antiochus, plays a role in the torture and execution of the seven brothers and their mother from today's reading. In his second letter to the Thessalonians, St. Paul mentions the persecutions and trials this community has undergone. Sandwiched in the middle of these two readings, today's psalm is fittingly a prayer for rescue from persecution.

When have you most needed the Lord's strength and faithfulness to continue in the face of life's trials?

## *Someone is Watching and Wondering*



Recently I was asked to name people who influenced my faith. Since November is the month we remember all those who have died I hope you won't mind if I share three people who were so important in my early years.

The first, as you can see is a rather ordinary looking woman, not famous, certainly not a canonized saint, but a very extraordinary lady. Her name is Dorothy Watson and she was my teacher for fourth and fifth grade (our school often had split classrooms with two different grades and one teacher.) I have very fond memories of those years because Ms. Watson made learning fun and exciting. Although there was already a small flame in my heart for science, Ms. Watson ignited that flame which became a roaring fire that has never left me. She also brought History and English to life by introducing stories and books about real people such as Laura Ingalls Wilder and Abraham Lincoln. She didn't simply present facts and dates from a textbook, she lead us in experiences of life and diversity. Ms. Watson did so much more than teach subjects, she accompanied us on a journey of discovery, challenging myself and my peers, and encouraging us to reach higher and higher, continuously setting new goals and looking towards our dreams.

I'm sure there are other teachers, and I hope I became one, who pushed their students to lean and set goals rather than simply memorize, complete assignments, and pass exams. For Ms. Watson, however, teaching material wasn't enough.

As I stated above, she journeyed with us both as a group and individually. Although I never remember her teaching religion (we did celebrate Christmas and participate in Christmas choir performances at our school), I believe Ms. Watson lived a Christ-filled life. She accepted each of her students as unique. She respected each of us and encouraged our talents and passions. She cared for us and helped us overcome difficulties both scholastic and personal. She laughed with us, studied with us, and yes sometimes cried with us. She helped us understand what it means to take responsibility for our own actions and to live as caring, loving, grateful human beings. I know this may seem hard to believe for a teacher of fourth and fifth graders, but that was her, loving, forgiving, and caring.

As many of you know I have a few ideas and opinions, which frequently are different from other people. I tend to find my own path while trying to remain considerate and open to God's will. In my memory, Ms. Watson was the first person who instilled the idea that my uniqueness is OK. In fact she always encouraged me to be myself. Ms. Watson lived and loved all her students as individuals and I know I continue to love her and am grateful for the gifts she shared with me. Thank you!

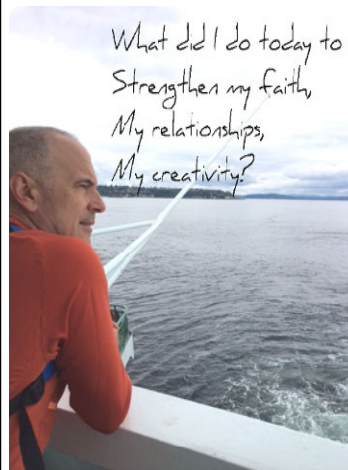

#### Did You Know?

The Book of Psalms, which we pray regularly at Mass after the first reading in the Mass, is a collection of 150 prayers, poems and hymns that were gathered over an extended period of time and are the key to the spirituality of the Old Testament.

Seventy-three of the psalms are attributed to King David while the other psalms were written by various other authors, many of which were written long after David's death. Each psalm has its own unique character and encompasses the range of human emotions from joy, praise and celebration to sorrow, lament and depression, and as St. Augustine has written, "...everything written here is a reflection of us". What a beautiful way to pray to God and make our human experience one of faith!

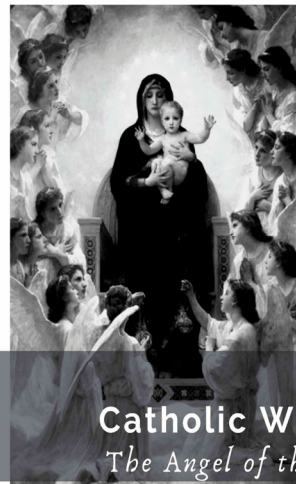
## FALL BLACK BASH AT ST. GABRIELS MUSIC! GAMES! GLOW IN THE DARK BINGO!
