From the Pastor's Pen

On the major holidays in our country, especially Christmas, Easter, and Thanksgiving, most people want to be with their families and loved ones. One estimate states that over 54 million people will be on the roads this Thanksgiving time. For some, Thanksgiving simply means no school, a time off work, time off that extends into Friday and the weekend, seeing a movie, watching football on TV, just relaxing, and, of course, Black Friday shopping. Most of the time the celebration includes a large dinner with turkey the traditional fare. Often in the days before Thanksgiving children in school will do art-work, drawing and displaying pumpkins, turkeys, and pilgrims.

Probably most people don't pay much attention to the story of the First Thanksgiving, at least the little we know about it from the early stories. Settlers from England encountered great obstacles, including harsh weather and the building of shelters. With the help of Native Americans, these settlers planted seeds and reaped the first harvest. Being a people of deep religious roots, they felt the need to give thanks to God for blessings. The stories say that they invited the Native Americans to be their guests at the meal.

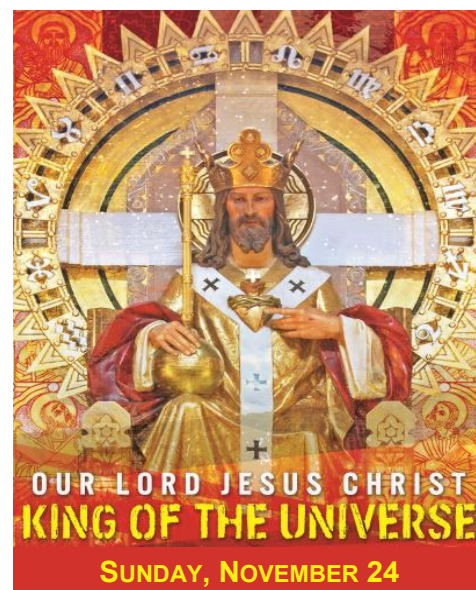
As Catholics of the United States of America, we celebrate the same way as other Americans except that we have another tradition that should be added, another meal that is unique and special: the table of the Eucharist, which is our great Thanksgiving. The Eucharist reminds us that thanksgiving is not a one-day occasion, but a weekly and daily reminder of the gifts we have received. So yes, we make the effort to be present at Mass on Thanksgiving Day. But really every day should be a day of gratitude. We pray especially in thanksgiving for our family and our loved ones. We take the time to say "thank you" to parents and grandparent, to children, relatives, and friends. Thanksgiving is also a time to express gratitude to God for all of our material blessings: food, shelter, clothing, medical and school facilities, military and police protectors. And finally, especially, we thank God for our faith, for the rich heritage of our Catholic Church, for the sacraments and sacramentals that enrich and strengthen us, and for our St. James Parish Family. Let this Thanksgiving time include gratitude for all those blessings

When you came into church today you walked by our Advent Giving Trees filled with gift tags. One tree has tags for children's gifts, another for adults, and another for Hope Gift Cards.

If you choose a gift card tag, you can take it straight to our special Hope Gift Card Table in the Gathering Space; buy your card right there; and your shopping is done! Buying your Hope Gift Card at this table helps relieve congestion around the regular Hope table while still benefitting the parish.

New Drop Off Location For Returning Gifts

All gifts need to be returned by Noon Sunday, December 8th at the new curbside drop off location in front of the old church. To make it easier for you to return your gifts, we'll have volunteers available 30 minutes before and after Masses to meet you at the curbside to accept your gifts and bring them into the Narthex where they will be stored and sorted.

So that we don't cause traffic problems for cars arriving for Mass, enter the parking lot at the north entrance nearest Academy Sports, turn at the last left before entering the circle drive in front of the church. Pull along the curb and form a line running in front of the gym school doors and Narthex.

And remember, when the Advent Giving Tree Shoppers begin shopping for gift requests that haven't been filled, they could really use any extra discount coupons you might be able to donate. If you can, please take them to the Gift Card Table in the Gathering Space.

Someone is Watching and Wondering



The last person I want to introduce this month of remembrance is my grandmother, Lily G. Brubaker Hamit. Let me just say, "What a Lady!" The last time I saw her alive she told me; "I have lived a good life, traveled in a covered wagon, lived in a sod house, helped farm a homestead, raised five children, enjoyed eight grandchildren, saw a

man walk on the moon, and came to visit you in a jet plane." Quick summary but that was my grandma, full of spunk, adventurous, willing to share stories, caring for others, and loving family and friends. She could be stubborn and petulant one minute and baking a pie, taking a walk, or quilting and sharing the latest news with her church group the next. I cannot remember when she didn't have beautiful white hair, and the dark spot by her ear is a hearing aid (she had substantial hearing loss until surgery in her late 70's, enabling loss of the aid.)

One summer my parents sent me to stay with grandma and grandpa. I was with them in Oklahoma City during June and part of July. That summer is one of my fondest memories. They didn't have television, only a radio, my grandmother didn't drive, and there weren't any other kids living close to their house. My Uncle did bring one of my older cousins (I only had three) to spend time with me but mostly I was with my grandparents. My grandfather worked in real estate and I went with him a few times to see the homes being built but generally it was just Grandma and I. She kept me busy and mostly out of trouble; I sometimes had my own ideas. I was never bored.

That summer, grandma taught me to cook, garden (she raised magnificent flowers including prize winning chrysanthemums), sew, embroidery, and what little I know of quilting. One of my favorite pass-times was helping Grandma make Raggedy Ann and Andy dolls; I stuffed their body parts before assembly. Over time she made hundred of these dolls, having two faces, one awake and smiling the other asleep and still smiling, with clothes to match for the girl or boy who received them. Grandma also took me shopping, to a nearby park, and to church twice a week, one for her Quilting-bee and lunch (I thought it was fun to sit under the quilting frames and watch the needles moving up and down) and of course to Sunday school and church every week. We walked everywhere, unless Grandpa drove us. I think the most important lesson, however, was how my grandparents cared for others, never asking for anything in return. They were quiet, giving, generous, and loving. I hope that lesson is still part of my life.

Did You Know?

Celebrating feast days can be traced back to the Old Testament and our Jewish roots. They commemorate an event such as Christmas, Pentecost, Easter, etc. and/or to remember and honor a saint. Most are celebrated on a same date each year (a saint's feast day, Christmas, etc.) while others are on a different date depending on the date Easter is celebrated (Ash Wednesday, Pentecost or Ascension, etc.) Universal Feast Days are those that are celebrated by the entire church throughout the world, while Particular Feast Days are those that may be celebrated by a religious order or in a certain diocese or country of a particular saint. The feast days of saints are commemorated on or near the date of their death, not birth, so that we celebrate the day they were born into eternal life. Here's an interesting fact: There are only 3 birthdays in the liturgical calendar that the Church celebrates. One is Jesus, but can you name the other two?

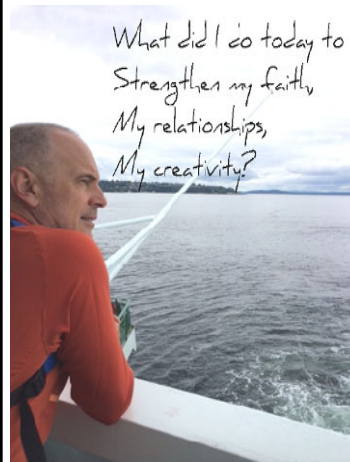

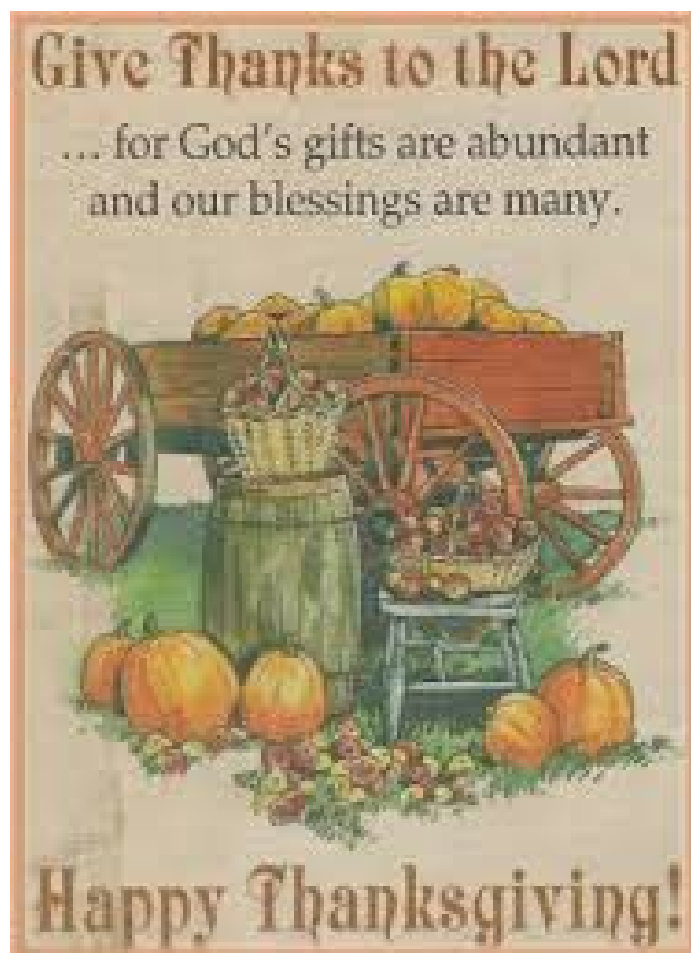
