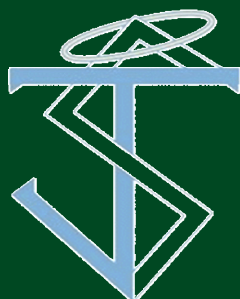

Someone is Watching and Wondering



In the Gospels there is nothing written about Jesus' life from the infancy narratives until age twelve, then nothing more until His baptism by John and subsequent ministry. In the first century, however, it is known that a Jewish boy would have attended synagogue (the Jewish house of prayer) and received religious instruction under the direction of a rabbi. At age five the boy would begin study of scripture (mostly memorization), by ten he would study *Mishnah* (the Jewish oral law), *bar mitzvah* would take place at age 13 and by age 15 the young man would study the *Talmud* (Jewish civil and ceremonial law.) One can reasonably conclude, therefore, that Jesus was well schooled in Judaism. According to an article by Roy B. Blizzard and David Blvin (*Biblescholars.org*), "we can say with great certainty [that as a boy Jesus]. . . was studying, committing vast quantities of material to memory – Scripture, *Mishnan*, *midrash* (commentary on Scripture), *halachah* rabbinic legal rulings) – all the available sacred literature of His day. . . exactly like most of the children of His day." Thus, when in the Gospels Jesus is called rabbi a first century Jew would understand that He was speaking as a learned man. Jesus did not, however, teach in the same ways most rabbis of the time taught. Instead He often taught using parables.

A parable is nothing more than a simple story used to illustrate a moral or spiritual lesson. Jesus' parables, although appearing simple and memorable were filled with imagery, they were surprising and generally paradoxical. His parables turned the listeners expectations up-side-down. For example in the parable of the good Samaritan the wounded man's neighbor isn't the priest, Levite or an Israelite but rather a Samaritan, a man despised by the Jews. This Samaritan showed compassion when his heart was moved to care for the badly beaten man laying in a ditch. When we hear this story we have three options: disbelief, identifying with the Samaritan, or identifying with the beaten man. Our first thought is to take the role of hero, helping those in need. Taking the role of the victim, however, leads to an understanding of being cared for by an enemy. This parable proclaims the enemy (Samaritan), the hated one as the hero who loves as Jesus loved. I suggest that His parables re-imagined a world in which to live, i.e. how do we interact with our enemies; are we surprised by their compassion?

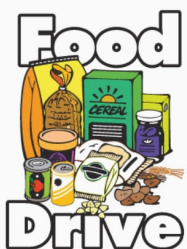

Did You Know?

The Gospel of John is very different from the other three Gospels. In the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, focus is given on Jesus' teaching on the Kingdom of God through parables, healing and miracles.

In John's Gospel, Jesus' teaching stresses relationships. Jesus teaches of his relationship with God and our relationship with Jesus through seven miraculous signs and long discourses. There are several passages in John's Gospel about the role of the Holy Spirit, while the other Gospels hardly mention the Holy Spirit.

John was an eyewitness to the life and ministry of Jesus and is known to us as "the disciple whom Jesus loved" (John 21:20, 24). The main purpose of John's Gospel is "that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in his name" (John 20:31).

Central to the Gospel of John is the command to love. We are shown through Jesus' words and actions how God loves us and how we must love God and one another.

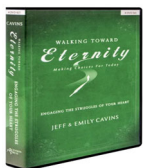
Eucharistic Ministers Needed

Spiritual Adoption Program Your Baby's Progress

If you spiritually adopted a baby during Respect Life Month in October, we thank you.

Just as a mother-to-be gets regular updates from her doctor, here is the update on the baby that you spiritually adopted.

Month 2 - "I Can Jump"

Your baby is making progress developing all of his external features and internal organs. His brain is functioning at 40 days. His mother can hear his heartbeat now on an ultrasonic stethoscope. Baby-teeth buds are present at 6 ½ weeks.



And it has been reported that a two-month old baby can suck his thumb. From this moment, your spiritually adopted baby grows and refines his body. But everything he needs to survive after birth is already present by the end of the eighth week.

Month 3 - "I Can Suck My Thumb"

Your baby is quite active in the womb now, although her mother won't feel her for another couple of months. If her mother's womb had a window, you could watch your spiritually adopted baby squint, swallow and move her tongue. She can make a tight fist if you touch her palm. She is breathing amniotic fluid which continues until birth, although she obtains the oxygen her body needs through the umbilical cord. The baby you are praying for weighs one ounce.

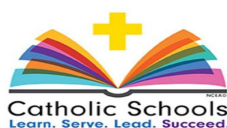

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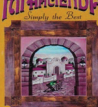
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
