From the Pastor's Pen

Each year in the Church's calendar, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord is celebrated on February 2, forty days after the feast of the Nativity of the Lord. Because this year February 2 falls on a Sunday, this feast replaces the liturgy of the 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The story of the Presentation is found only in Luke's gospel. It recalls a tradition that goes back many centuries in Jewish history. The Jews observed many ritual laws, especially laws regarding purity. Certain occasions rendered a person "impure," such as the woman who gave birth to a child. The law required that a firstborn son be taken to the temple in Jerusalem (although it could also be to a local synagogue) for the ritual of purification to take place. In the ritual the mother is declared to be "pure" and the son dedicated to God. It was customary to give an offering of a lamb, but in the case of those too poor to offer a lamb the offering of a pair of turtledoves or young pigeons was acceptable. To us the ritual law may seem to be strange, but it had meaning for the Jewish people and it shows that Joseph and Mary were pious and holy in observance of the law.

The other detail in the story is the presence of two elderly people, Simeon and Anna, who came to the temple each day for prayer. Simeon took the child in his arms and spoke words which seem to foretell the specialness of Jesus: that he would bring salvation and be a revelation to the Gentiles and the glory of the people Israel. The elderly woman Anna also sees the child Jesus as someone unique: he would be the one that the people of Israel were awaiting.

How might the account of the Presentation find meaning in our lives? It reminds us of our Christian tradition: that a newborn be brought to the church for the celebration of baptism. In this ritual we also dedicate the child to God, initiating the child into the ways of discipleship. Just as Joseph and Mary were so faithful and devout in observing the Jewish law, so should Christian parents today be just as faithful and devout not only in presenting their child to God, but also bringing the child up in the ways of the faith. Just as Simeon and Anna were present at the Presentation of Jesus, so Godparents and other believers are present to be witnesses and assure parents of their support. This feast is a wonderful time to re-affirm our own baptismal commitment and our dedication to living gospel values.

We meet on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month. We gather at 3:30pm in the church to practice. Then we lead music at the 5:00pm Mass.

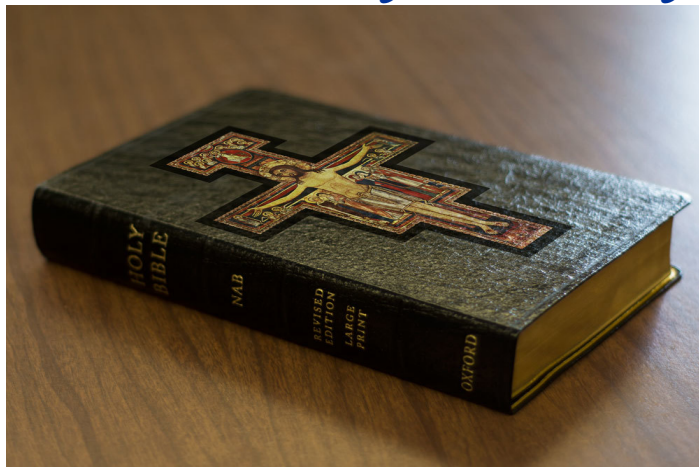

Someone is Watching and Wondering



When an individual prepares for and receives the Sacraments of Initiation through the RCIA Journey there is a period following initiation (generally at the Easter Vigil) when they enter a period known as *Mystagogy*. This period (formally the 50 days from Easter Sunday until Pentecost) is intended to assist the neophyte (newly initiated) to continue their formation and become engaged in the ministries of the Church. For me, however, *mystagogy* does not end at Pentecost following initiation but continues throughout life. I believe that we all need to continue our conversion by turning our hearts and lives over to the love of God, and understanding who we are as His people.

Throughout the years many individuals have requested a more formal continuation of their journey which would include Bible study, Church history, and tradition. In fact I recently received the request for a journey into Holy Scripture. After much prayer, thought and study I have finally agreed to offer a *New Journey Beyond RCIA: The Bible, Who, What, Where, and Why*. The first part of this journey will be an introduction to the sacred scripture, followed by digging deeper into individual books of the Bible. The sessions are open to anyone interested in continuing their faith formation, especially those newly initiated. If you, or someone you know, is interested in being part of this journey, I wish to personally invite you to an information session on February 12th (the second Wednesday of the month). This and subsequent sessions will be offered on the second and fourth Wednesday of each month, at 6:30pm in the New Church Conference room just off the entrance to the Parish Offices. 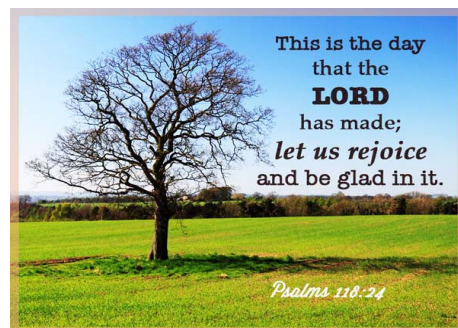

Did You Know?

When we die, our eternal destiny is decided by Christ at the moment of our death.

Those who die in God's grace and friendship are destined for Heaven, while those who purposely turn away from God and His love are destined for Hell. However, many of us aren't quite ready to enter Heaven. This is where we need to understand what Purgatory is. The Catechism tells us that Purgatory is *not a place* where our souls go, but a *process of purification*. When Jesus died on the cross, He took away the eternal consequence for our sins and gave us access to the Father.

When we die, because of our sinful nature, we will still have things in our heart that shouldn't be there and attachments to things of this world. Purgatory is the purification process we undergo to rid ourselves of these so that we will be able to give our heart fully to God and love Him the way He deserves.

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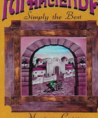
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
