



As always, any individual who is experiencing symptoms of illness is not to attend a blood drive.

For questions about eligibility due to travel outside the U.S., medications or medical conditions call 1.800.688.0900.

Regarding COVID-19, do not donate if:

You are experiencing a fever or other symptoms of COVID-19 (cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing)

You have had close contact* with someone diagnosed with or suspected of having COVID-19 in the last 14 days

You have been diagnosed or suspected of having COVID-19 until 28 days after your illness has resolved.

* Close contact is defined by CDC as being within 6 feet of an infected individual for a prolonged period of time.

St. John Paul II said, "I encourage Christians regularly to visit Christ present in the Blessed Sacrament, for we are all called to abide in the presence of God."

The Lord is pursuing us at every moment of every single day. He wants us to spend time with Him before the Blessed Sacrament.

Interested in offering up a Eucharistic Holy Hour? Or wondering on what to do in the silence before the Blessed Sacrament? A couple suggestions are:

- Read the Bible
- Lectio Divina*
- Contemplate the mysteries of the Rosary
- Just sit in silence and spend time with Him. Encounter Jesus in a special way that He is personally inviting you to come and share your heart with Him.

*Lectio Divina means "divine reading" - Read a scripture, then meditate, pray, ask for God's intercession, and contemplate.

Spiritual Communion

Did you know that if you are not able to receive the Eucharist at Mass, such as in our current situation, you may make a daily Spiritual Communion while at Adoration, at home or in the midst of your daily work.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY SAVE THE DATE - APRIL 19



Divine Mercy Sunday is the Sunday following Easter, Our Lord asked Saint Faustina to pray and work towards establishing a Feast of Divine Mercy on that day.

When Pope John Paul II canonized Sister Faustina (making her Saint Faustina), he

also, on the same day, surprised the entire world by establishing Divine Mercy Sunday as a feast day for the entire Church.

He set aside this day as a day of forgiveness of sin and punishment due to sin (with sacramental confession 20 days before or after and receiving Holy Communion).

He even prayed the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, the prayer that Jesus gave her, at the saint's tomb. Given all these connections between St. Faustina and Divine Mercy, is it any wonder that Pope John Paul II died on the Vigil of Divine Mercy Sunday (the evening before the feast day), which fell that year on April 3, 2005 and was canonized St. John Paul II on the Feast of Divine Mercy, 2014.

Our Divine Mercy celebration at St. James will be April 19 from 2:00 - 3:30pm in the church.

A 🎵 from the Liturgy/Music Office

We want to be sure that we are keeping everyone updated on what's happening here at St James during this time. There are a few changes, some mandated by the bishop, that we have put into practice.

Celebration of the Mass Live-Streamed . . . We will be livestreaming a closed Celebration of the Mass on Sundays at 8:00am via Facebook Live. (This does require a Facebook account.) We will then upload the recording to our YouTube channel St James YouTube Channel for you to follow along at home at your convenience. Even though Fr Mike and Fr Michael will still continue to celebrate daily Mass, per Bishop Johnston's directive, these are closed to the public. We plan to have daily reflections and homilies posted on our website and our YouTube channel.

Church and Chapel Hours ... The church and chapel will be open every day from 7am until 7pm for individual prayer or meditation. We will have adoration on Thursdays until 7pm, but the chapel is limited to no more than 10 people at any one time and we ask everyone to be respectful of that limit.

Parish Office Hours . . . Parish offices will be open daily during the week from 9am until 4pm for any parish business or help that you need. We understand that many will be facing financial difficulties at this time; if you are able to continue your regular giving, we are very appreciative, as our expenses will not diminish. We have frozen all discretionary spending, but there are some expenses we can neither eliminate nor avoid. You can drop off your Sunday envelope during office hours, or place it in the baskets that will be available in the Gathering Space. We will regularly check those baskets and pick up any envelopes. If you would like to switch to electronic giving, those forms are also available in the Gathering Space. We appreciate your continued support of our parish!

Someone is Watching and Wondering



This Sunday we will celebrate, the Second Scrutiny with our Elect (those preparing for baptism, confirmation and eucharist at the Easter Vigil). The emphasis of this Scrutiny is to understand our

participation, involvement, or lack of involvement in changing society for the common good of every individual, which the Church defines as communal/social sin. As indicated above, communal sin is any free and deliberate act, word, thought or desire that turns us away from love. Unlike personal sin, however, we may connect ourselves to communal sin through our lack of actions, words, or desire to allow God's love to flow through us in such a way to alter or eliminate structures, laws, organizations, and cultural states. which continue to perpetuate poverty, environmental pollution, racism, lack of medical care and education for all individuals, sexism, and other forms of social/cultural disparity.

To emphasize what I wrote last week, communal/social sin harms our relationship with God and with one another. We sin whenever and however we fail to live agapically; neglecting or stigmatizing our brothers and sisters regardless of their physical attributes, culture/ traditions, beliefs, life circumstance, mental ability, or sexual orientation. When we consciously choose to look the other way, criticize, judge, or condemn one of God's children or any group of people, when we fail to care for the environment, when we permit the existence of organizations and social structures which disenfranchise others, we are committing communal/social sin. We also commit communal/social sin whenever we fail to see the world as it is without questioning how it should be; whenever we fail to work for change(s) that benefit and respect others, especially those without the voices of power speaking for them.

In the RCIA Journey our Elect have discovered the universal call to holiness, that is rooted in Christian baptism. They are aware that disciples of Christ Jesus are called to holiness, always and everywhere. With our Elect we must freely acknowledge that when we consciously and deliberately fail to heed this baptismal call, we are sinful. In solidarity with our Elect we must also understand that holiness does not exist outside of community. God calls us to support one another, and to live Jesus's call to love. Holiness is not about winners and losers; it is about every person being given the opportunity to live their humanity in a sacred, safe environment. Remember each of us is called to participate in the scrutinies, as we are daily called to Live Mercy and Be Holy.

Solemnity of The Annunciation Of Our Lord March 25



The Annunciation (from Latin annuntiatio), also referred to as the Annunciation to the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Annunciation of Our Lady, or the Annunciation of the Lord, is the Christian celebration of the announcement by the Archangel Gabriel to the Blessed Virgin Mary that she would conceive and become the mother of Jesus, the

Jewish messiah and Son of God, marking His Incarnation. Gabriel told Mary to name her son Jesus, meaning "YHWH is salvation".

According to Luke 1:26, the Annunciation occurred "in the sixth month" of Elizabeth's pregnancy with John the Baptist. Many Christians observe this event with the Feast of the Annunciation on March 25, an approximation of the northern vernal equinox nine full months before Christmas, the ceremonial birthday of Jesus. The Annunciation is a key topic in Christian art in general, as well as in Marian art in the Catholic Church, having been especially prominent during the Middle Ages and Renaissance.

To reflect on this great moment in history, here are 3 practical lessons we can learn from Mary:

- 1. Be prepared to be used by God. As an unmarried young woman from Nazareth, Mary has a very low social status, but God doesn't care about that. Mary continues a long list of people in the Bible who felt inadequate (Moses, Rahab, David, Jonah, Naomi to name just a few) that God uses to fulfill His promises.
- 2. **Put your faith in God**. In great contrast to Zechariah, the father of John the Baptist who doubts Gabriel's announcement that he'll have a son, Mary is described by her cousin Elizabeth as "she who has believed" (Luke 1:45).
- 3. Live your life as a servant of the Lord. Mary ultimately responds to Gabriel with the powerful words, "I am the Lord's servant. May your word to me be fulfilled" (Luke 1:38). Through Mary's willingness to be used by God, we have an incredible example of the Apostle Paul's later request for followers of Christ to be a "living sacrifice" (Romans 12:1).

Ways To Fast

Last week's "Our Faith in Action" column discussed fasting. Space constraints prevented printing of some ideas about ways to fast. As the column stated, "fasting can take many forms in our lives and doesn't necessary have to do with food."

Here are 5 ideas for you that involve fasting.

- Coffee or Soda How about giving up your daily trip to Starbucks or QuikTrip and then giving the money you would have spent to the needy. Same goes for junk food, chocolate, etc. None of these things honor God and are bad for thegift of our bodies.
- Social Media Yes, that's right. If this idea is overwhelming, how about taking a break from just Facebook or Instagram? There's a big world out there that is full of God's blessings.
- Netflix Free up some time for prayer or even trying one of the new reading platforms – books.
- Excessive Noise and Distractions Shut screens and audio devices out of your life as much as possible or plan a quiet space of time in your day and adopt a spirit of silence. This is a great time to have a conversation with God and He with you!
- The Snooze Button Start your days during Lent by getting out of bed when you hear your alarm and get moving. Think of how much you can get done!

Make An Act of Spiritual Communion

For the next couple of weeks we will not be able to receive the Eucharist at Mass.

In cases like this the Church encourages us to make an act of "spiritual communion," where we unite ourselves to God through prayer. It is a beautiful way to express to God our desire to be united with him when we are unable to complete that union in the reception of Holy Communion.

Below is a traditional prayer of spiritual communion that can be prayed daily in atonement for all the profanations and sacrileges He suffers because He wants to be with us."

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament.
I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul.
Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart.
I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You.
Never permit me to be separated from You.
Amen.

Did You Know?

The goal of Lent is to build new virtues or good habits in our lives through prayer, fasting and/or almsgiving. By doing this we are learning to live a life in which we honor, glorify and thank God for the sacrifice of His Son, Jesus. This week let's talk about prayer. Prayer is simply talking and listening to God. Your prayers don't have to be perfect. Just talk and express your concerns, your hopes and dreams, your needs. After all, prayer helps to build a personal relationship between you and God. Prayer can take many forms as you will see in the ideas below.

- Take 15 or 30 minutes each day in quiet time by yourself to pray. Get a notebook and write a letter to God each day thanking Him for all His blessings and telling him your concerns and needs.
- 2. Read about the virtue of and pray for humility. Seek out opportunities to humble yourself in your relationship with others by giving someone else credit or recognition throughout each day.
- 3. Take some time to read the daily Mass Scripture readings each day. Read Bishop Robert Barron's thoughts each day for better understanding at www.wordonfire.org. There's also a link on this website to the daily readings.
- 4. Go to Eucharistic Adoration each week on Thursday in the chapel. You can make a short visit or try to stay for an hour.
- 5. Forgive those who have offended you and pray for those who have hurt you.
- 6. Go to Mass every day. Invite someone who doesn't regularly attend Mass to come to church with you one day during the week.
- Make a conscious decision before work, chores or study to offer up whatever you are doing in love to God. Do these with joy, not grumbling or griping.
- 8. Give thanks daily for the trials in your life with the confidence that God will turn them to good.

Continually look for the big and small blessings in your life. Keep a gratitude journal.

Next week we'll look at ideas for almsgiving. What a powerful way to help each other!

We Pray to our Lord Jesus for healing


